### Springtown City Council revises ordinances on storage containers, accessory structures and fences

Springtown City Council revised ordinances regarding storage containers, accessory structures and parallel fences at its meeting last month.

Previously, the accessory structures ordinance required 20-foot setbacks from the rear and sides of the property.

During the public hearing at the meeting, resident Carlos Munoz said he would like to add a shed to his backvard, and he called the rear "a little excessive."

"I guess this ordinance was written for houses with more land," Munoz said. "That would put the shed right in the middle of my backyard."

The change in the accessory structures ordinance addresses Munoz's con-David Miller said, by changing the setbacks on the side and back to 5 feet.

The revised ordinance allows temporary and portable structures under 200 square feet to not have a permit, but a permit is required if the structure is on a concrete slab, Miller said. 



He is on the A/B honor roll with a 3.5 grade point average.


### **COWTOWN TO SPRINGTOWN**




