Parker County Center of Hope has provided resources to families in poverty for 25 years, said Mike Kelley, who presented the award. Springtown library director wins Extra Mile Award at Chamber awards gala

Springtown Public Library Director Andie D'Avignon took an opportunity to shine at the Springtown Area Chamber of Commerce's annual awards gala by wearing a sparkly black long-sleeved tunic to the event.

"I put my whole heart into what I do," she said after receiving the award.

City Administrator David Miller, who presented the award at the gala, described the Extra Mile Award as for employees who stand out the most during the year and "(go) that extra mile, if you would, to help other employees and be a part of what's going on."

D'Avignon joined the Springtown Public Library staff in November 2013 and was promoted to director in June 2020. Miller said D'Avignon has worked to improve the library's service to its patrons, including looking for new materials, programs and services for the library to provide.

Miller also noted that D'Avignon often helps out at the city's events, such as at the Hop and Shop and Old-Fashioned Christmas.

D'Avignon's smile and personality is a "blessing to her coworkers and her patrons who she values tremendously," Miller said.

This award is voted on by all employees of the Springtown Police Department, Springtown Administrative Services Director Christina Derr said.

Victoria Thomas started her career with the Springtown Police Department as a telecommunications officer in 2017 after she graduated from Springtown High School, City Administrator David Miller said at the chamber gala.

Thomas left the department in 2020 to attend the police academy, and after she graduated from the academy, she started working at the Hudson Oaks Police Department as a patrol officer, Miller said.

Thomas returned to the Springtown Police Department as a school resource officer in September 2021. Earlier this year, she returned to being a patrol officer and was promoted to corporal in February, Miller said. She currently lives in Springtown with her husband who is also a peace officer.





and air conditioning units, saved his hide one summer. Kelley's unit had gone kaput, and he called Hughes' J&E Air Conditioning in Springtown.

Alvis currently serves the Springtown Area Chamber of Commerce on the Board of Directors and volunteers at chamber events like luncheons and Wild West Fest.


"There are so many other people that could be in this position," Alvis said after being awarded. "This award to me is not something you win, it is something you earn."

Covered Bridge Venue opened in 2020 but has "been a plan for longer than that - a dream, for longer than that," he said.

The first event held at the venue was a wedding that Kelley attended.

"It was a terrific wedding," he said. "It's a terrific venue. Great view. You can see Porcupine Stadium from the back. It's a great place."

The venue holds about 400 people.

The Dauenhauers have spent many years in the area, oversee a magnificent event space and earned the award, Kelly said.

"They've shared this facility with the school district, with the chamber, lots of community events," he said. "It's been a great addition to the Springtown community and brought a lot of people out that might not have ever known what was going on west of town."

Chantal Dauenhauer was out of town watching daughter Brinklee play at a volleyball tournament and couldn't attend the award ceremony. Rick Dauenhauer accepted the award and thanked supporters and mentors.

"This is great," he said. "Our family homesteaded here, and I was born and



utilities as well as medical, dental and counseling needs.

"In Parker County, this organization has been serving for a very long time, and it's made an incredible impact,' Kelley said. "Their reach is very significant."

In addition, Springtown residents participated in 250 class sessions and more than 1,400 life coaching and

advising appointments provided by Center of Hope. "The Center of Hope's vi-


