



Hidden Garden Events Venue hosts "Warriors Amongst Us"

Allegiance Title and Future Hope and Healing Center raise awareness for victims of domestic abuse with fashion show

On Thursday, May 11, Hidden Garden Events Venue in Lakeside hosted a fashion show to remember. This yearly Mother's Day luncheon and catwalk was first organized by Debbie Hall of Allegiance Title three years ago. From its beginnings, Hall wanted to center this event around promoting women and that's why they chose Azle's Future Hope and Healing Center (FHHC) as a beneficiary.

"FHHC provides shelter, counseling, support, and donated items to victims of domestic abuse in order to ensure that they don't have to return to abusive environments," founder Sally Daniels said. "We have provided 321 nights of safe sleep since Christmas by paying either motel fees or first month's rent."

A percentage of sales made at the number of shops inside the venue went to the organization and a table was set up for them to receive donations. FHHC was started by Daniels, who has 26 years of experience as a counsellor, eight years ago and gained 501c3 status in March of 2018. Four



Azle sees record economic growth for May



May 2023 sales tax payments break all previous records

In the month of April, Assistant City Manager Lawrence Bryant ended his monthly sales tax update with a question. "Will next month's payment be the first to surpass \$400,000?" The answer was yes. For the second time this year, Azle's sales tax payments broke

all-time records for the city. While some businesses report their sales tax numbers monthly, others do so quarterly. First in February, then in May, these quarterly numbers were added to the rest of the sales tax payments for the month.

Both of these months managed to break all previously held records, February's sales tax payment being

\$393,335.55 and May's at \$400,981.49.

What this means is that Azle businesses are making more sales than ever while businesses continue to move here and our population grows.

"We are very fortunate that so many businesses have taken an interest in the city,"

School board recognizes students for outstanding performances

Azle High School students were recognized for a variety of accomplishments at a Monday, May 15 school board meeting.

The Azle Visual Arts Scholastic Event (VASE) has made it to the last six state competitions that have been held. Azle High School student, Brooklyn Steward won a medal at the regional VASE competition, qualifying her for state. There were 71 entries at the regional and area competition. Brooklyn received the regional medal.

“[To put it into perspective] there were 32,000 entries at the state level and only 151 received fours” Azle art teacher Baryn Shepherd said.

Shepherd has since accepted the regional director position for region 11. Next

year’s VASE competition will be held in Azle High School.

“That’s going to do a lot for our school and our district,” Shepherd said.

“We have three sponsors for our FFA chapter and this year all three of them had a team that qualified for state competition,” CTE Director Suzanne Murr said.

The three teams were vet science, entomology, and dairy cattle. The entomology team won their Area Contest. “Our Area consists of 114 schools,” teacher Elizabeth Slough said. “They placed in the top nine percent of entomology teams in the state of Texas. They were able to compete in an invitational National Contest at Tarleton State University and they placed seventh at the National Contest.”

The dairy cattle team had one individual place third at District and the vet science

team placed in to top 11 percent at state.

Also recognized was Sherri Prather and the Azle CyberStart America competitors.

“This is our third year to compete in CyberStart America,” Prather said. “Our first year we qualified 17 people. Last year we qualified 32, this year we qualified 53. We finished first in the state of Texas and tenth

in the nation.”

In addition to that, Azle High School has received a gold award as a cyber opportunity school.

Azle cybersecurity students put in tremendous work this year solving puzzles and problems relating to cybersecurity in this national competition.

“Everything we’ve done is because of them,” Prather said. “They are outstanding.”

TCC District 4 Run-off election on June 10

Laura Forkner Pritchett and Bill Greenhill set to rematch for contested college board seat.

On June 10, there will be a runoff election for the District 4 Tarrant County College Board seat. Laura Forkner Pritchett and incumbent Bill Greenhill will be facing off again after receiving 42.26 percent and 30.46 percent of the vote, respectively. The two bottom

candidates from this race, Larry Dale Carpenter Jr. and Jack Reynolds, got 18.58 percent and 8.7 percent of the vote, respectively. It is not yet clear which candidate is more likely to receive the votes of these candidates. The other available seat for Tarrant County College Board, District 5, was won by incumbent Leonard Hornsby with 51.74 percent of the

vote. Applications for ballot by mail must be received by Tuesday, May 30. Early voting will take place from Monday, May 30 to Tuesday, June 6. The Azle ISD Instructional Support Center is located at 483 Sandy Beach Road, Suite C and will serve as a voting location for early voting and the June 10 election.

Azle City Council members re-elected, reconfirmed

Azle City Council members and the mayor were sworn in after three uncontested races and one victory for the incumbent, Brian Conner.



Reno residents packed city hall on May 15 to witness the swearing in of the city's new leaders.

After winning their elections earlier this month, Place 1 Council member Hernando Herrera, Place 2 Council member Tod Siedell, Mayor Hector Bas Jr. and Place 4 Council member Jennifer Vogle took their seats at the dais last week.

The transition of power at the meeting was a smooth one. Before stepping down, outgoing Mayor Sam White congratulated the newly elected officials.

"Holding a city office is no easy undertaking," White said. "It comes with problems and challenges that require collaboration with city staff, legal counsel and oftentimes (Texas Municipal League) experts. I want to thank my family, friends and all the city staff that helped me during the time of my office. It has been my honor to serve the city of Reno and its citizens."

Outgoing council member Jody Works, who was appointed to serve in Place 1 for several months and did not run for election, thanked all the candidates, congratulated the winners and described the races as "one of the calm-

When Bas took his place behind the dais, he said he appreciated the smooth transition and thanked outgoing Reno City Council members.

with Lego sets and culminated in him being a part of the Azle High School's robotics team. Throughout his school career, Lalonde attributes his success to the support of his friends and family. "They really motivated me," Lalonde said. "I've had a lot of good friends. I've known the same guys since elementary school, which has been really helpful...I've had a good support group."

Lalonde is particularly proud of his achievements in band where he is a section leader. "I've been in band since sixth grade, and I've been able to do a lot there. I've made the Region Band for the past four years in high school, qualified for Area." Lalonde described his favorite part of band as, "people coming together to make something beautiful."

Lalonde has been one of the top two students in his school since the eighth grade. "Our first transcript that we got was in the eighth grade and my rank was number two. I was like 'Oh man, I

didn't know I'd be that high. So, freshman year I took all advanced classes and woo-hoo I got up there." Lalonde's favorite subjects are math and science, and his favorite class is chemistry with Ms. Reasoner. In math and as a section leader in band, Lalonde is proud to have been able to help his fellow classmates. "I still had to ask some people for help, so I wasn't completely self-sufficient," said Lalonde. "Being in an environment where the people around you care as much as you do is definitely helpful with AP classes." Lalonde described his favorite part of his high school career as getting the clarinet solos and getting to play at the Alamo Dome in San Antonio. Lalonde plans on trying out for the bands at UT after he graduates.

"Don't be afraid to ask for help," Lalonde said. "And don't be afraid to just do it. The work is hard, but if you just do it, it's worth it... There are plenty of people that could have been [valedictorian], but it's kind of cool that it's me."

Lalonde said he was grateful to Azle High School for the number of advanced

classes that it offers. Inspired by his family's appreciation for natural beauty, Lalonde hopes to pursue a career in the renewable energy sector. "My parents always took me to national parks over the summers," Lalonde said. "They wanted me to see like, 'we live in America, there's so many beautiful natural things you can see here. It's just a drive away.'"



years ago, the center moved to Main St. in Azle, starting Hope's Bazaar. Hope's Bazaar is an upscale boutique and resale shop that funds and houses the FHHC. The shop is located at 141 W Main St in Azle. All the clothes worn by the models were sourced from Hope's Bazaar and many of the models were volunteers from the shop.

"My goal is that every home is a safe home," FHHC founder Sally Daniels said. "The mission statement [of FHHC] is to be the future of hope and healing by providing services and education to those in need and the goal is that nobody returns to an abusive home because they cannot meet their family's basic needs. We'll do anything we can. I've gotten on Facebook that I've got a client that needs diapers so that we can get those needs met and she doesn't go back to an unsafe home."

FHHC does not yet have a shelter but hopes to get one soon.

"Every year I say I hope to have it open by January 1 of next year," Daniels said. "Part of it is finding those resources and finding those people that know the people that have the resources."

The support that FHHC receives at events like this fashion show helps inspire and encourage Daniels and the clients that rely on FHHC resources.

"It makes me feel like people do care and understand," Daniels said. "When our clients know that the community cares about them and wants them to be successful and wants them to be safe then they're more likely to do that because they feel like they've got backing. When she's getting shampoo or whatever and I can say that it came from an event that we did, and people have brought items for you all then they

know they've got the support of the community."

Like many organizations of its kind, FHHC success stories may mean never seeing the client again.

"[I did not know how much of an impact I was making] until I was in a car accident two years ago," she said. "I was in ICU and my kids started telling me how these people had posted on Facebook and that they would pray for her and 'keep us updated.' I had no clue until then. It's my passion... I love what I do."

While the work is difficult, the difference Daniels makes in people's lives makes it worthwhile.

"[My favorite part of the work is] when I see somebody happy," Daniels said. When I see somebody that comes in and thought she couldn't do anything, she thought she couldn't stay gone, but she does. At Christmas when we provide kids with Christmas and they've never had Christmas before, Easter baskets, anytime I can see a bright smile."

First United Mortgage, First

American Home Warranty and other sponsors were also present to speak and support the event. Daniels described Cristina Calk of First United Mortgage as one of the biggest supporters of the FHHC. Calk hosts a different annual fundraiser for the organization.

A major selling point for the organization was that designer clothes, originally worth hundreds of dollars, can be found for a fraction of the price at Hope's Bazaar. Models struck a pose and showed off a selection of these clothes.

While fun times were had all around, Daniels kept the meaning and purpose of her organization clear.

"One in ten men and one in three women will be in an abusive relationship in Texas," Daniels said.

The FHHC has served clients from as far North as Justin and as far South as Burleson. Each person that comes through their doors is managed on a case-by-case basis and Daniels tries to find help for every client.

Texas Health promotes National "Stop The Bleed" Day

An emergency can happen at any moment, thankfully there are resources available that can help you be prepared to make the best out of it. In concurrence with National Trauma and Stroke Month, Thursday, May 25 is National Stop The Bleed Day. May 25, 2023, marks the sixth year since Stop The Bleed was established as a public health initiative by the American College of Surgeons.

Stop The Bleed is aimed at helping prevent deaths by bleeding. Healthcare experts have long been advocating this training to prevent deaths by severe hemorrhaging during accidents or multi-casualty emergency situations.

Texas Health Dallas and Texas Health Harris Methodist Hospital Fort Worth, both designated Level I Trauma Centers, offer regular classes on Stop The Bleed. Resources are also available at other trauma services departments throughout the Texas Health system.

Local hospitals offer classes and resources on how to render first aid for physical trauma and hemorrhaging.

Kristi L. Ramon BSN, RN, Trauma, Stroke, Chest Pain, and EMS Coordinator at Texas Health Harris Methodist Hospital in Azle is able to teach classes and provide resources for those interested in attending a Stop The Bleed class, or in becoming instructors themselves.

"With the increase in violent events across the nation, the general public can feel empowered to make a difference in a life-threatening event after the successful completion of a Stop The Bleed course," Ramon said. "Tourniquets have been a staple in emergency rooms for years. Table saw, boating, motorcycle, and gun accident victims are just a few that may have a tourniquet in use on arrival to an emergency department."

These classes are promoted as an excellent resource and training experience for any

manner of workplace, church organization or club. More than two million people have received the training, according to the American College of Surgeons. In the United States alone, 60,000 people die every year from uncontrolled hemorrhaging, 75 percent of which are the result of trauma.

On Sunday, June 4, there is a free Stop The Bleed Basic Instruction class at Texas Health Dallas Professional Building 5 (Texas Health Resources University) located at 8194 Walnut Hill Lane, Auditorium, 1st floor, Dallas, TX 75231. Directly following Stop The Bleed, a Civilian Response to Active Shooter Events (CRASE) class will be held at the same location. CRASE is taught by trained law enforcement officers who teach the community how to stay safe during an active shooter event.

A Lesson in Anatomy

This is the third post in a series on the art of healthy conversation.

"Anatomy is the branch of biology concerned with the study of the structure of organisms and their parts. Anatomy is a branch of natural science that deals with the structural organization of living things. It is an old science, having its beginnings in prehistoric times." (Wikipedia)

Most of us had some basic study of anatomy during our educational journey. Of course, our main interest was in the informal study of the anatomy of the opposite sex, but that is another story for another day (or maybe not).

So, what does anatomy have to do with conversation?

I'm so glad you asked! Here's the deal: When we think of conversation, we typically think of the exchange of words. That is, we concentrate on what we are saying. And then we wait (often impatiently) for the other person to speak so that we can speak again.

You've probably heard the old saying, "We have two ears and one mouth so that we can listen twice as much as we speak." (Attributed to the Greek philosopher Epictetus - 50 - 138 AD).

Boom! Anatomy! To be completely candid, I've got to say that most of us are lousy listeners.

As I looked at that sentence, I realized that it is a perfect example: "I've got to say ..."

We operate under the assumption that our words are the most important part of the conversation. They NEED to be said and we NEED to say them.

How might our conversations be more artful and productive if we really were to listen—seeking to hear with understanding—twice as much as we speak?

In his classic leadership book, "The Seven Habits of Highly Effective People," Stephen Covey said that one of the habits is "Seek first to understand, and then to be understood."

It's not that our words and point of view are less important than the other person; it is that conversation is intended to be a dialogue where both participants walk away with a better understanding.

What if we were to hold our thoughts long enough that we were certain we had a good grasp of the other person's perspective?

What if we were to listen for changes in the tone and pace of the other person's voice to hear some of the story behind the words? (This is one of the inherent weaknesses of online communication).

Some additional anatomical lessons:

We also have two eyes that can assist us in conversation—to respectfully look each other in the eye and to observe body language.

We have two hands—to touch appropriately and to serve and assist with grace.

We have two feet—to either move closer or to step back and give space. Whatever is most appropriate at the moment.

Words matter. But communication and conversation require more than words. Our anatomical design can remind us of that reality.

And here's a final thought: Perhaps we only have one mouth because words are so powerful. With them we can wound or heal. How will we use ours?

Bryant said. "The continued growth of Azle's business community is a testament of the work that the current and previous City Councils have done to make Azle an attractive place to do business and call home."

May 2023's numbers represent a 14.53 percent increase in the amount of money collected in May 2022, or \$50,880.33. From the \$400,981 collected, \$320,785.19 will go to the city's general fund and \$80,196.30 is earmarked for street maintenance.

Several new businesses have opened in just the past few years in Azle, including Burger King, QuikTrip, Starbucks, and Discount Tire, with more businesses currently under

construction.

"More businesses in Azle means our residents can stay closer to home to purchase the goods and services they want/need," Bryant said. "Because of the financial hardships that many have experienced due to the waning pandemic and now record inflation I believe people are spending more of their money on essential items and less on non-essential items. I would say much of the shopping available in Azle falls into the essential items category."

While these numbers certainly reflect the daily growth, we see in the City of Azle, inflation does also play a role in increasing the prices of goods and services subject to sales tax and the collected sales tax payments themselves.

In recent months, retail sales have fallen nationally, and many cities have

seen a decrease in collected sales tax payments as a result. Azle has seemingly bucked this trend and is on a great track for long-term economic growth. The May 2003 sales tax payment was only \$95,007.03. In the last 20 years, sales tax payments have more than quadrupled for Azle.

"In 2003, the year I started working here as a full-time employee, the city's general sales tax payments for the entire year totaled \$953,199.56," Bryant said. "Twenty years later, that amount was eclipsed by almost \$40,000 in the first three months of the year and the city is currently on a pace to collect over \$4,000,000 (of which 20% is street maintenance revenue) in 2023. What a difference twenty years makes."





them all season.


And what a season it was. The Hornets made it three rounds deep into the play-offs before falling to the Grapevine Mustangs, the top-ranked 5A team in Texas.

The Hornets finished 26-10 on the season. Only two other baseball teams in school history have won more games in a season. Azle made it to the regional quarterfinals for the first time in 17 years and for the fourth time in school history.

On Thursday, May 18, the first game between those teams turned into what Smith characterized as an "instant classic," a magnificent battle that stretched five hours and 13 innings before Azle fell 6-5.

Game 2 on Friday, May 19, was different. Grapevine took an early lead, won 11-0, and ended Azle's season.

During the first game, Azle students had dressed in all white. The next night, they showed up color-coordinated in green.

"The pressure is on for Grapevine," said Riley Russell, wearing a white shirt and cowboy hat during the first game.

The games were played at Eaton High School in Haslet. Russell stood with about 75 other kids in the end section of the bleachers, stomping their feet and making as much noise as possible to show support for the Hornets while distracting the Mustangs.

"The pressure is on for Grapevine," Russell said. "We're bringing it to them, for sure. I think we're in their head."

He and his friends made the trip to Haslet for a simple reason.

"We love to support the Hornets," he said.

Their support stretched for hours without waning that first night. Game 1 began at 7 p.m. and ended around midnight. Strong pitching, timely hitting, and exemplary defense from both teams was on display all evening.

Declan Dahl started on the mound for Azle and went 5-2/3 innings with 7 strikeouts. Austin May pitched in relief, throwing 6-2/3 innings while giving up 4 hits with 7 strikeouts. Ethan Bissonnette struck out the two batters he faced.

Tyler Akers, Grant Tune, and Billy Spratt logged multiple hits, and Spratt added 2 RBI. Luke Olmsted smashed a triple and an RBI. Cole Webb, Garrin Graves, and Ryland Liptow had a hit apiece.

A swath of green shirts filled the student section on game 2, and the number of students appeared larger than before.

"Last night was Thursday, and people had other stuff going on," said Bryan Rager, a junior. "On Friday night, they are open more. Everybody showed up."

Lightning just prior to gametime, however, had delayed the start for 45 minutes. Rager, wearing green Mardi Gras beads over a green shirt, sat next to Hayden Andres. To kill time, each held a small plastic megaphone while their friends tried to toss ping-pong balls into them.

Andres, wearing a vintage Hornet football helmet, said students came to spread school spirit.

"It's the first time going to round three with Coach Smith," he said. "It's pretty good."

Jack Clark stood alongside the others holding an empty propane tank painted Hornet green and filled with ball bearings.

"When you shake it, it makes a lot of noise," he said.

Shaking the tank turned out to offer other benefits to Clark, a prominent tennis player at the school.


"It's a good workout," he said. "I like it."

The second game wasn't as competitive, with Azle falling behind early before losing 11-0 to end the season.

Jackson Davis, team MVP this season, was disappointed by the final loss but appreciated what his team had done as a whole.

"We battled," he said. "Nobody expected us to be here. It felt good to get this far. It feels like the job wasn't finished, but I know in the coming years, they will pick it up and keep it going."

Western Texas College in Snyder for a couple of years before transferring to a larger school.

"I hope to keep pitching and do well," he said.

He will look back on his high school career with fondness.

"I feel satisfied," he said. "There is a lot we could have accomplished, but we did as much as we could."

Dahl, the winning pitcher from game 1, was saddened by the final loss but put his disappointment in context.

"The emotions are hitting me now," he said, pausing to collect himself. "We had a great season. It's unfortunate that this game ended how it was. I can't wait for the juniors to take it over next year. I can't wait to come back and watch them."

He expressed confidence in Azle baseball moving forward.

"It's a great program," Dahl said. "Coach Smith does a great job with everybody here. So do all the coaches. The players are great. The community is great. I love everybody."

This year marked the fifth consecutive season for the Hornets to make the playoffs. That had never happened before at AHS.

Azle's head coach knew he'd been a part of a special season, and he wanted to express his gratitude.

"I want to thank all the parents, faculty, and staff at Azle High School, the Azle ISD Administration, Azle ISD School Board, the athletic office, and the Azle student section for their support this year," Smith said.

the North Texas High School Rodeo Association.

Lindsey-Kay Reichert's horse, Lil Miss Chickasaw, or "Sister," earned Barrel Horse of the Year.

Hevenli Scribner's horse JSH Lucky Bottom Roy, or "Roy," won Pole Horse of the Year.

At the NTHSRA Finals Invitational Race, five of Azle's young women brought home belt buckles after finishing among the top riders.

"I'm so proud of this team and the efforts they gave all season long," Kristy Scribner said.

READY TO ROPE, RIDE

The rodeo finals pitted the best high school riders, ropers, and doggers against one another in Saginaw.

Kasen Scarlato showed up early, as usual. The first event was more than an hour away, but Scarlato likes to prepare and go through his routines without feeling rushed.

On May 20, the last day of finals, he and partner Jesus Leyva would be competing in team roping. Scarlato had shelled out \$50 on a new rope, and he was admiring the texture and feel.

"I just got this rope yesterday," he said, running his hands along a light blue rope that matched the blue cowboy shirt he wore. "It's a head rope. I like it because I know I can throw pretty far and be able to reach and catch."

A tired old rope doesn't feel the same.

"When you have an old one, sometimes they want to figure-8," he said. "When you have a new one, they will stay open the whole time and go right over the horns."

Scarlato wore out five or six ropes this season. Winning payouts at rodeos helps to cover costs.

Hevenli Scribner, a sophomore, qualified for the finals in three events. After running barrels, she and her horse, Roy, left the arena and headed toward her trailer.

She was proud of Roy's performance and didn't mind bragging on him.

"He was pretty good, pretty consistent," she said.

Roy nudged her with his nose.

Scribner kept paying compliments, and Roy kept nudging her back, pushing her off balance at one point.

"He wants treats," she said, laughing.

Scribner still had poles to run. She and Roy continued

on to the horse trailer for snacks and a water break while waiting for the event to begin.

Roy ran well, just as he had all season. During finals awards ceremony, Roy was voted Poles Horse of the Year.

Nickolas McElhannon, junior, competed in one of the most difficult events, bronc riding. He was thrown on Friday and Saturday but had scored enough points by winning during the regular season to assure himself a top 6 finish and a belt buckle.

The average score at finals is added to season totals to determine the placements. The top six finishers for the year in each event win belt buckles.

The rodeo season is one of the longest in high school sports, stretching from August to May and involving two dozen multi-day events. McElhannon broke an arm earlier in the season but recovered and rebounded in time to qualify for finals.

He rode bucking broncs on both nights at finals and was thrown each time.

On the second night, "About two or three jumps in, my hips came out from under me," he said. "I went forward. Went over my riggerin'."

The night before, McElhannon "got about halfway down the arena, four or five seconds, then the same thing happened," he said. "I came off to the side."

He'd ridden both horses earlier in the season and won on them. This time, the horses made moves he hadn't anticipated and sent him flying.

McElhannon will be back next year as a senior to ride again.
