Azle ISD elementary students celebrated the 100th day of school

Students all over Azle ISD celebrated the 100th day of school, but elementary kids arrived at school Wednesday morning dressed as 100-yearolds, complete with drawn-on wrinkles, fake gray hair, and hunched over with walking canes. "We had a lot of fun

leading up to the day" said Lisa Koehler, principal of Liberty Elementary School. "The kids participated in many educational activities that revolved around the number 100."

Everyone was getting in the spirit. Many of the teachers were also in costume to celebrate the milestone in the school year — all with

their own creative way of using the day as a learning tool. "It's not just a fluff day" said Dr. Stephen Garretson, the principal of Walnut Creek Elementary. "Everyone gets to have fun, but we keep our focus on the curriculum and learning."

The day was led by the dedicated teachers. Anjolee Roberts, a second grade

Reno disincorporation petition lawsuit may be headed toward trial

A district court judge denied a motion for summary judgement in the case of the Reno disincorporation petition lawsuit

However, some of the plaintiffs said this case is far from being over and are looking forward to a trial date.

A motion for summary judgment is defined by the American Bar Association's website as "(asking) the court for a judgment on the merits of the case before the trial. It is properly made where there is no dispute about the facts and only a question of law needs to be decided."

The motion was considered by 415th District Court Judge Graham Quisenberry on Feb. 1, and the order to deny was signed on Feb. 7. Before then, the plaintiffs and defendant — Mayor Sam White — both filed court documents arguing for their respective sides of the case.

In August, Reno residents

submitted a petition to dissolve the city. The petitioners claimed they had more than the 400 signatures required to trigger an election.

However, White did not order an election and claimed in his response to the summary judgement motion that the number of valid signatures of qualified voters was fewer than 400 when crossreferenced with the city's voter registration list.

Since then, petitioners Eric Hunter, Joy Jenkins and Jennifer Vogle filed a lawsuit against White to order him to call for the election for disincorporation. The plaintiffs' lawsuit claims that the reasons given for invalidating signatures are illegitimate. Hunter also said that some signees were wrongly labeled as not registered because they reside in a different Reno precinct.

The evidence in the plaintiffs' summary judgement motion included statements

Azle resident celebrates 105 years

Henrietta Morrison has done a lot in 105 years. She witnessed the struggle of the Great Depression, the end of a world war, and the complete transformation of technology.

Morrison was born in 1918 in Dakota County Minnesota, where she lived for more than 20 years. Her Father was selfemployed as a mechanic and machinist, and her mother worked as a house cleaner for a local landlord. Like many in those days her family struggled financially. She attended school until she was 13, then she dropped out to help support the family by working with her mother as a house cleaner. "I wish I had been fortunate enough to finish high school and get a better job than what I had," said Morrison, "but I was brought up in hard times."

When Morrison was 16 years old, she took a job in a factory that manufactured office supplies. She worked until she got married. When World War II broke out and all the factories and manufacturers were in desperate need for good workers, and with most of the able-bodied men being sent overseas, almost all manufacturers hired women. Morrison was one of those women.

She took a job at Swift & Company, a meat packing plant in St. Paul, Minnesota, cutting pork and other types of meat. After the war, the men came back and the plant wanted to give them their jobs back — but the women who had been working there for the duration of the war had seniority. Swift & Company would assign the heavy jobs to the women hoping they would quit from inability to perform their job. But Morrison was not one to

be bullied. "I took every job they offered," she said, adding "some of them were pretty hard, but I mastered it."

Morrison worked at Swift & Company until it closed in

After Swift & Company closed, she volunteered for the ladies VFW, organizing and coordinating events. She was so dedicated to her work that she received the 1990 Bell Tower Senior Volunteer of the Year Award. Morrison worked as a volunteer until her retirement, then moved south to Texas to be closer to her family.

Morrison truly lived a bluecollar life. Coming from modest beginnings and working until she simply couldn't. The most prevalent change she says is in technology. "I think the biggest change is all this automation" she said. "Machinery has taken a lot of manual labor."

Morrison spends her days

surrounding herself with family and playing bingo with her neighbors of her hospice. She has a brother, Lerov. who still lives in Minnesota, a daughter, Jane, who lives in Azle, and a son, Glen, in Flagstaff, Arizona.

Local business owner wins 2023 poultry championship at Stock Show

Robert Chapman, owner of Chapman Carpentry in Azle, took home the 2023 championship in the Fowl category at the Fort Worth Stock Show.

Chapman has been raising and showing birds since he was 16. He originally started breeding pheasants and quail, but he wanted some chickens to hatch his pheasants. After

a while Chapman decided that process that requires conhe was ready to do shows. He knew a good friend who had some white silkies chickens. After raising and trying different breeds, Chapman landed on the single comb white leghorn chickens, the same breed as his winning chicken.

Like most breeders, Chapman raises his animals from the time they are born. In this case he would hatch them from the eggs. It's a

stant upkeep and attention so that all sides of the egg stay warm. After the eggs are hatched the real work begins. Chapman must keep the birds as clean as possible, and for animals like chickens it is a labor-intensive process that can be as jarring as it is time consuming. The chickens are judged on features like cleanliness and type, and condition of the feathers.

Chapman's winning fowl was one of 18 that he had entered for the competition and was the winner of over 400 that were judged. "I had brought some Rhode Island Reds, and white leggers, but I brought more whites and reds," said Chapman. Unlike the other classes, the birds are not auctioned off to the highest bidder.

Parker County homestead exemption deadline coming April 30

Now is the time to file for a homestead exemption with the Parker County Appraisal District.

The homestead exemption reduces the amount of property taxes a homeowner must pay each year by removing part of the home's value from taxation. It also limits the amount that the appraised value can increase to 10% annually. This is commonly referred to as a "homestead cap." The homestead cap doesn't kick into effect until the second full year that a homeowner has qualified for a homestead

exemption.

Although homeowners can only claim one property as a homestead, a new law in 2022 allowed property owners to claim a pro-rated general residence homestead exemption on a property that becomes their principal residence at any point in the year. Previously, property owners could only claim this exemption if they owned and lived in the home as of

It's free to file for a homestead exemption. In order to qualify, provide the appraisal district with a copy of your Texas driver's license

or Texas ID card with a picture ID and a completed application. The address on the license or ID card must match the physical address of the residence for which you are applying. The application is located at www. parkercad.org.

Generally, the completed application and required documentation are due no later than April 30 of the tax year for which you are applying.

Completed applications may be hand delivered or mailed to Parker County Appraisal District at 1108 Santa Fe Drive in Weatherford.

For the last three or four years, we have been in a time of the deepest turmoil and discontent that I have witnessed in my 61 years on this planet. I will not say that we are more divided than we have ever been in our country (620,000 who died in the Civil War might have a case), but I think one thing is clear:

"Normal" ain't coming back.

Memory is not vision.

The past can inform the present, but returning to the way things were is not an option.

The best thing we can bring forward from those who came before us is not what they did, but the visionary, pioneering spirit that gave them their inspiration.

The COVID pandemic was not a temporary interruption; the world has changed.

And the way forward is not in choosing sides and fighting each other. It's finding the commonalities we can build on and envisioning the future that could be if we are willing to live with some differences and uncertainty.

I recently read the words of

Jesus in Mark 3:24-25 — "If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand. If a house is divided against itself, that house cannot stand."

In these verses, Jesus was — at the same time — addressing an immediate accusation and stating an eternal principle.

When teammates become opponents, or when family becomes foes, destruction is at hand.

Pioneers understand they don't have the luxury of fighting over preferences. They need each other to survive and move toward the vision.

During Monday's Reno City Council meeting, White said a law firm also reviewed the petition and counted fewer than 400 valid signatures.

"Had a summary judgment been accepted and the judge found there to be 400 valid signatures, as the mayor, I would have had this item placed on the ballot for voter consideration," White said during the meeting. "But seeing there are 3,100-plus citizens in Reno - 2,700-plus that did not sign a petition -I am obligated by the law to honor a requirement of 400 valid signatures which they did not provide."

White's response to the summary judgement motion claims that the plaintiffs should have done more to prove the validity of each signature, such as showing that each signature was witnessed and establishing voter registration of signees before the petition was filed.

The declaration of Parker County Elections Administrator Crickett Miller was also dismissed by White's response. Miller's office reviewed the signatures

on the petition for voter registration and counted 423 valid signatures. However, White's response states that only the city's mayor has the required authority to validate signatures.

The plaintiffs' rebuttal claimed that Miller "is more familiar with signature validation requirements" than White.

White's response states this case needs a trial to resolve certain issues.

"Plaintiffs' motion for summary judgment should be denied because [1] plaintiffs failed to conclusively prove 400 valid signatures were submitted to the defendant to call the election and [2] there is conflicting evidence as to the number of valid signatures contained on the petition, creating a fact issue," White's response to summary judgement states. "The case should be set for trial to resolve these issues."

Hunter and Vogle said the move to request a trial is a delay tactic. Having a trial means this case won't be resolved until after the May election, and the disincorporation issue won't be able to appear on the ballot until the next mayoral election in 2025 unless the judge decides otherwise.

As of Feb. 14, a trial date has not been set publicly.

Both Hunter and Vogle claimed that not allowing the disincorporation issue on the ballot is suppressing the voices of Reno voters.

"I fully expected the mayor to do everything that he could to push this out past the deadline," Hunter said. "He's trying to avoid following the law. That's what he's trying to avoid doing. And it's really sad. It kind of forces you to have to question what kind of government or leader do you have that fights so hard to keep people's vote off the ballot?"

White said it's up to the plaintiffs to order the trial and push the case to the next step.

"The ball is in (Hunter's) court if he wants to do a jury trial," White said. "We're not requesting a jury trial from the city because there's no point in that. The burden of proof is on him.'

Vogle remained adamant that the fight to put the disincorporation issue on the ballot will continue.

"We're not going to just give up," she said. "We know

that we're doing the right thing, and we didn't come this far just to say, 'Oh, well. He got it pushed past the deadline, and it's not going to get put on this ballot,' but it's not going to go away."

RESPONSE FROM THE COUNCIL

Reno City Council previously approved hiring a lawyer to represent the city in this lawsuit. Last month, White confirmed that the city has agreed to pay a total of \$7,500 for this law firm's work.

At Monday night's meeting, some council members made it known that they don't want the city to spend any more money on this case.

After meeting in closed session, council member Shelli Swift said she doesn't want the city to spend any more money on this lawsuit and that residents should be able to vote on this issue.

"This is a lawsuit that we can prevent, and we've already spent a small fortune on it," Swift said during the meeting. "I'm done with it. I'm saying put it on the ballot." Deputy Pro Tem Hernando

Herrera agreed with Swift that no more money should be spent. Herrera said he didn't want to spend any money on legal expenses in the first place, and he feels that the council spent more money without being properly informed.

"I feel like we were kind of bamboozled in a way that we said, 'OK, let's just spend a little bit of money, and then come back and reevaluate.' That never happened," Herrera said during the meeting.

He continued, "We've gone ahead and agreed to a certain monetary amount, and the initial charges for that legally went two or three times that. When we made the second decision to spend \$7,000, we didn't have all the information that we needed to make that decision. If I'd known that we'd already gone over three or four times the additional \$2,500, I would have never agreed to \$7,000. And so, like Shelli, I'm done. As far as I'm concerned, we spent our last dime."

Swift's and Herrera's comments were followed by applause from the audience.

Abbott issues disaster declaration, seeks fed help

ABBOTT ISSUES DISASTER DECLARATION, SEEKS FED HELP

Gov. Greg Abbot has issued a disaster declaration for Texas counties affected by the early February ice storm and is seeking a federal declaration as well for areas in Southeast Texas affected by rare January tornadoes. The ice storm caused considerable damage to property and power outages in the affected areas. The declaration for ice-storm damaged counties includes Denton, Hays, Henderson, Milam, Smith, Travis and Williamson counties.

"Through this disaster declaration, we will be able to provide additional assistance to Texans and communities who have experienced property damage and localized power outages from this ice storm." Abbott said.

The ice storm brought tree limbs snapping and crashing onto power lines. More than 170,000 Austin households were without power for several days, with some going more than 10 days without power.

Abbott also requested a presidential disaster declaration for counties in Southeast Texas hit by tornadoes and severe storms in late January. That request includes Harris, Jefferson, Liberty and Orange counties. If that request is granted, residents and businesses in those counties would have access to federal loans and grants.

RELIGIOUS FREEDOM BILLS DRAW BIPARTISAN SUPPORT

Three bills have been filed in the Texas House aimed at improving Texans ability to practice their religions. The Austin American-Statesman reported that state Rep. Salman Bhojani, D-Euless, filed the bills to expand the state's list of optional holidays to include more religious holy days; prevent standardized tests being

given on those days; and ensure that religious leaders of all faiths can legally perform marriages.

Bhojani, one of the state's first Muslim legislators, was joined at a news conference by Republican state Rep. Jacey Jetton, R-Richmond, who is Christian, and fellow Muslim state Rep. Suleman Lalani, D- Sugar Land.

"As legislators, it is our duty to ensure that Texas is the religious freedom state, where we can practice our faith with pride, where we can pray in a church, synagogue, mosque, temple, jamatkhana or gurdwara, where we can love God by any

name," Bhojani said. **PLAN TO BAN TIKTOK ON STATE-OWNED DEVICES RELEASED**

Abbott last week also an-

nounced a security plan to ban the use of the popular video app TikTok as well as other software on all stateissued devices, as well as personal devices used to conduct state business. Abbott contends the Chinese-owned company can harvest data from TikTok user's devices and poses a security risk to Texas.

After Abbott issued the initial order in December, The University of Texas at Austin banned TikTok on all its Wi-Fi networks. The latest security plan also includes other lesser-known apps, such as WeChat. A number of hardware manufacturers are also prohibited from being used by state agencies and employees.

TikTok, which is known for its short videos, is owned by the Chinese company ByteDance and has more than ticipated breakup of La Niña 86 million users in the United States.

A WET JANUARY FOR PARTS OF THE STATE

January brought above-average rainfall for large swaths of East Texas while the rest of the state had below-average

precipitation, hydrologist Mark Wentzel wrote in the Texas Water Development Board's monthly report. Drought conditions expanded by five percentage points to include 54% of the state, while statewide storage in water supply reservoirs is at 72.5% of capacity, down about 10 percentage points from what is normal this time of vear.

Drought conditions have been all but eliminated in the eastern portion of Texas, while much of the state is in moderate to severe drought conditions. The worst drought conditions now are in a circle of counties around Bexar County.

Wentzel predicted that except for northeast Texas, much of the state will see expanded drought conditions.

"However, with the anconditions later this year, there is some hope that the rest of Texas may see at least some easing of drought conditions as early as May," he wrote.

FINAL ROUND OF EMERGENCY SNAP BENEFITS

This month brings the final allocation of emergency food benefits provided by the U.S. Department of Agriculture and distributed to eligible households by the Texas Health and Human Services Commission. The extra minimum of \$95 per household began during the start of the COVID-19.

COVID-19 CASES SHOW DECLINE

The number of new cases of COVID-19 reported by the Coronavirus Resource Center at Johns Hopkins University in Texas in the past week dropped to 25,229, with 189 deaths reported. The number of lab-confirmed COVID-19 hospitalizations in the state dipped slightly to 1.952, according to the Texas Department of State Health Services. The number of actual cases is likely higher, since people who test positive using a home kit generally are not reported in the case count.

In her youth, Trelle was a counselor at Camp Longhorn. 
Glenn Nobles 1956-2023

New Garbage Rates in effect February 1, 2023

Beginning February 1, 2023, Azle residents/business owners will see an increase in their garbage/recycle rates. (Current residential rate \$21.20 – new rate \$23.09/month) The City's contract with CWD allows for an annual market adjustment each February 1st based on increase in fuel costs, landfill costs, and on the percent of increase in the annual Consumer Price Index (CPI) for all DFW Urban Consumers as published by the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics. The new garbage service rates are available on the City's website at www.cityofazle.org or a hard copy is available at City Hall.

Azle residents benefit from a variety of waste disposal options - twice a week solid waste, once a week recycle (option to choose either 65 gal cart or 18 gal bin), once a week bulk item collection, once a month bulk brush, and a twice a year "X-treme Green Event" that is held as part of the city-wide clean up.

The X-treme Green Event gives Azle residents a convenient way to dispose of their household hazardous waste, e-waste, metal appliances, tires, and on-site document shredding. The 2023 X-treme Green Events are scheduled for May 6 and September 16.

Free recycled paint for Azle residents

In an effort to continue our recycling efforts, the City and CWD created a remix paint program by blending the usable paint collected at Azle's X-treme Green Events and offering the recycled paint (latex & oil-based) **FREE** to Azle residents. Paint is in one (1) gallon containers and available at Azle City Hall, 505 W. Main Street. *The City of Azle does not guarantee the purity, quality, consistency, etc of the paint distributed.*

Azle native publishes his first book

Every town wants to boast that one of its sons or daughters has gone on to achieve great things. They are a credit to the town and the people who give the town its spirit.

Dr. John Lisle, a lecturer at the University of Texas in Austin, has Published his first book, "The Dirty Tricks Department: Stanley Lovell, the OSS, and the Masterminds of World War II Secret Warfare." The book chronicles the stories of the scientists who developed top secret weapons for the OSS the precursor organization that would eventually be restructured into the CIA, during World War II. Among their creations were the bat bomb, truth drugs, silenced pistols, suicide pills, and camouflaged explosives.

Lisle grew up in the Oak Harbor area of Azle. He is the youngest child of Mike and Lynette Lisle, who were teachers at Azle Junior High School for more than 30 years. His father was a history teacher and his mother taught science. It's a strange twist of fate that their son became a Ph.D professor of the history of science. "I really didn't ever think about becoming a teacher or a professor or anything like that," Lisle said. "When I was younger, I thought I wanted to be an architect."

Lisle was an avid track and cross-country runner. As a freshman he competed in the regional cross country mile. Unfortunately, he developed Compartment Syndrome, a blood flow restriction that can damage muscles and nerves in his knees that required surgery to mend. While unable to join his team at meets, John still attended every practice.

After graduating from Azle High School, Lisle went on to get his bachelor's in history from Texas A&M, then his Ph.D from the University of Texas in 2019. Yet he maintains that Azle is where he feels most at home. Any time he comes home he makes a point to rediscover his favorite restaurant in town — El Paseo. "The main thing I miss is the sense of community" he


"My dissertation in grad school was on the scientists within the intelligence community, like the CIA," he said. "And I would occasionally see references to this man Stanley Lovell and he kept popping up everywhere, and I realized that he was in charge of this branch of the OSS, the precursor to the CIA. I figured this story (was) just too good not to tell."

Lisle took on the task of writing about Stanley Lovell and his time with the OSS. John spent more than 3 years' of his personal time and energies on the research.

"I did all the research in the archives in D.C., and throughout the country, I did all the writing, and the main reason I did it is because I love the story," he

After completing his work, John submitted a book proposal to several literary agents. Fortunately, one of them saw enough promise in the proposal to represent him. The agent then shopped the proposal to St. Martin's Press, a publisher in New York.

"I had spent years researching and writing this book in my spare time before ever knowing whether it would be published, so it was validating to finally get







Azle athletes sign letters of intent to play college ball

His dream was about to come true.

Luis Cruz had wanted to play baseball at Azle High School for a long time, and in 2019, his freshman year, the time had just about arrived.

Then, a pandemic rounded third base and slid hard into everyone, shutting down schools and sports, hopes and dreams.

Overcoming adversity is a trait shared by all 16 of the school's athletes who congregated recently to sign national letters of intent to play college ball. Members of the Class of 2023 will go down in history as the ones who had to battle a pandemic in their first year of high school.

"It's one of the best memories I've ever had," he said of his years at the school. "Even COVID. It made me evaluate myself. It inspired me to get bigger and get stronger, help my family out — my mom, my dad, my sister. It made me a mature man."

Makynna Hinkle will head to McPherson College to play volleyball. She received academic all-state recognition as a Lady Hornet.

"I'm just excited to sign and go to Kansas next year," she

Her older sister, Camryn Hinkle, graduated in 2022 as a Lady Hornet. Camryn plays volleyball at Kansas Wesleyan University, not far from McPherson. The sisters will compete against each other at times since both schools are part of the National

Athletics.

After she graduates from AHS, Makynna Hinkle will load her possessions into her car, leave home for the first time and drive to McPherson.

The drive will take seven hours "if I don't speed," she said, glancing at mom Amy. "Good answer," mom said.

Camryn and Makynna are best friends and don't particularly enjoy going against one another on the volleyball court but don't hold back. They've done it at club ball around Azle, and they can do it in college.

"I'm excited to see my girls be in the same division and play each other," Amy Hinkle said. "They are 30 minutes apart in Kansas. For the next three years, we'll get to watch them go at it. They're both setters, so it's kind of interesting to see them play the same position and go against each other. It should be fun.'

Next to Hinkle's table sat

"I'm going to start my degree for mechanical engineering and electrical engineering and hopefully go to Texas A&M afterward," he said.

She's almost there. On Feb. 10-11, Davis won the regional title at the UIL Region 1-5A Wrestling Championship in Canyon. She and teammates Pella LeFever, Kaitlynn Kirkland and Jacy Williams outwrestled numerous opponents to earn the right to compete at the state championship on Friday and Saturday at the Berry Center in Cypress.

Powerlifting season began Jan. 12, and Azle boys and girls have achieved remarkable things during the first month of the season.

By mid-February, the boys team accomplished something no other powerlifting team had done in school history. The Hornets won all three of their meets, and Azle athletes won best lifter awards in both categories at all three tournaments.

The girls have been on a power trip of their own. At their first meet, seven Lady Hornets placed in the top three. At their second meet on Jan. 19, they finished in second place out of 18 teams. Numerous Lady Hornets set personal records and finished just a few points out of first place.






