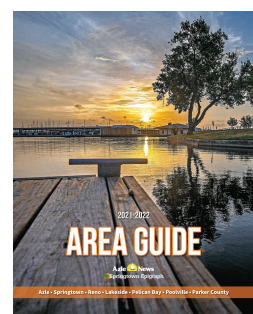
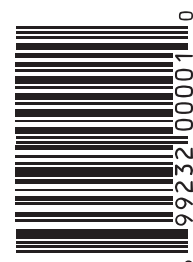
### 30 YEARS AGO...

# Azle Fire honors its own

Three members of the Azle Fire Department were honored for 20-plus years of service with the department.

Fire Engineer Billy Johnson has served for 20 years, and Lieutenant Steve Lemming and Chief Will Scott have each served for 25 years. They were all recognized for their service at the July 20 city council meeting and received standing ovations from those in attendance.

“(Azle Fire Department) is a relatively young department with only two retiring from the department,” said

Chief Scott.

Chief Bobby Fowler hired the current chief as a firefighter/paramedic in 1996. At that time, the department consisted of a combination of volunteers/part-time staff, and 9 full time shift personnel. The fire department was housed in the old municipal complex at 613 SE Parkway, along with city administration and the police department.

“Two of the offices were made into bedrooms with bunkbeds for the firefighters,” said Scott. “The department relied heavily on volunteers for major events such as structure fires and second out calls.”

Scott was promoted to fire chief in December 2002 after a lengthy search for Chief Fowler’s replacement.

Now, the fire department is housed in its current location at 900 Lakeview Dr., moving from just 4,800 square feet of space to 17,000 square feet. A department of 10 paid personnel in 1996 has grown to 21 full-time employees.

“The growth of the department has been accomplished by the support of the citizens, city councils, and city administration seeing the need for additional emergency services to the community, and for that I am truly grateful,” Scott said.

You may have noticed that I tend to stumble over the words "old" and "antique". Well, I have gotten to the point where some younger folks could, mistakenly of course, refer to me as old and I guess there could be a little truth to that. However, using the word antique instead of or in the same sentence with old is really stepping across the line folks; I guess in today's world vintage or seasoned might be an easier word to swallow.

Now, let's visit about a subject that tends to become a part of the hot topic of the day every few years or so, that is cross breeding or hybridization which falls into the larger category of genetics. Hopefully most of you all know that misinformation in the wrong hands can be a very misleading and even dangerous thing. And just

like misinformation in the wrong hands, genetic experimentation in the wrong hands can also be a dangerous thing.

But this is just going to be sensible and practical discussion, so let's stay calm as we go down this trail. If you are twenty-five years old or older you were alive in 1996 when the world's first successful cloning of a mammal from an adult cell was announced in Scotland. Dolly the Sheep, as she was referred to, made world news, and according to some, the end of the world was at hand. Now please, please don't think that I am making light of the subject of genetic experimentation. With some of the things that were done during World War II and even since that time in some dark corners of the world, this is a topic we should always keep a fairly tight grip on.

Dolly's cloning did not cause world wide human genetic mutations as some alarmists predicted; we stayed calm, maintained a "steady hand on the wheel" and kept a close watch on this type of research, as we should with all research and experimentation. But again, stay calm, seek out the truth and find out what is really going on and be very certain of your sources.

First off let's recognize the

fact that genetics is a factual science, it is not theory. Genetic research has been going on for quiet some time. Gregor Mendel, a Moravian monk, performed his famous genetic inheritance research in 1865 and 1866 using pea plants. Just as a sidenote, since Mendel was doing his research in Moravia, which is now considered a part of the Czech Republic, I'm not sure what kind of peas he used, but I am sure that if he had been in our Southern states, he would have used Blackeyed peas.

There was genetic research being done before Mendel, but he is probably the most recognized early genetic researcher. So at least since 1865 there has been testing and experimentation happening in the field of genetics and in 99.9% of the cases it has been positive research for improvements in our world.

So again, when genetics and research are paired up into one phrase, stay calm and pay attention.

Ok, at this point you have probably figured out the direction that I'm going with this topic. Next week we'll spend our time visiting about the positives and very few negatives of genetic research, testing and actual real life uses in the Agricultural sector.

"No political agenda, no religious agenda ... I'm here for anyone," Norman said, as he waved at a passing car with horns blaring on the corner of Speer Avenue and Central Drive.

Not long after that, a woman in a van pulled up, rolled down her window and shouted from across the street, "Thank you! You're awesome!"

Norman, a Springtown resident, began listening in May. It all began as an idea from his grandson Kameron.

Last year, after going through some personal stuff, Norman realized he had nobody to talk to.

"People I thought would reach out didn't," he said. "I've always gone to church here in Azle. Not one person reached out."

Norman, who is raising his grandson, said the 15-year-old thought "it was sad" that nobody came to lend an ear.

"Maybe that's something you can do," Kameron told his grandpa. "Listen."

"So I bought a canopy, some chairs, painted a sign, printed a sign and began," Norman said.

He even has a box of tissues, water, hand sanitizer, baby wipes — things that might come in handy during a visit.

On the first day, it was lonely the first three hours.

"And then a lady pulls up," he said.

"I can't talk to my friends or family about this. I can't talk to my church friends about this either. I need a stranger," she said.

"Nobody is stranger than me," Norman recalls saying.

"And then people started showing up," he said. "At times, I've had three people waiting in line."

Norman has had his share of battles. Not counting

the one that led to this new journey, he has suffered a broken back, battled cancer twice, and has had multiple, complex surgeries including one where his spinal cord was severed.

"I'm blessed to be able to do this," he said.

His wife Brenda, director of Young Sprouts Creative Learning Center in Azle, is the breadwinner while he takes care of the home front. She fully supports his endeavor but had one question.

"You're a talker. How are you going to be able to do this?" she asked him.

"It's been a learning experience for me. It's made me slow down and listen," he said.

Norman only offers his opinion if someone asks.

"I've had people talk about what they are going through and ask, 'What should I do?'" Norman said.

Once from a car at the red light, passengers shouted through the window, "Tacos

or hamburgers" at which he advised, "Tacos!"

One of the questions he gets asked the most is, "Why are you doing this?"

"No one can help everyone, but everyone can help someone," he answers.

Norman said he never thought so many people would come, some all the way from Fort Worth and Dallas after photos of him hit online communities such as Reddit and Love What Matters.

"Every time I am out here, I am amazed people keep coming," he said. "Some come back and give me updates."

The stories he hears are hard to bear at times. When Norman gets home, he must decompress.

"Sometimes I go home at night and cry ... It hurts me," he said.

He also prays for each one of his visitors. As for how long he will do this?

"I guess until people stop coming," he said.

Prior to that, I use about five hundred words to try to give you a few reasons for it.

Today, I want to start there.

not be prepared for what tomorrow holds because we are entering it exhausted.

It is so easy to preload a bad day!

It's almost as if we expect to be cranky because we deserve—dadgummit—to be cranky!

And then—surprise, surprise—something goes wrong during the day and our preloaded expectations are validated. We knew it was going to be one of those

days!

And it goes downhill from there.

Have you been there? Be amazing. Seriously?

Let me repeat the Bible verse I started with today: "This is the day the Lord has made. We will rejoice and be glad in it."

Ponder this: "This is the day." Today. The only day in which we have the option of living.

Yesterday is gone. Tomorrow is not assured. Actually, tomorrow will never arrive, because when it does, it will be today.

"This is the day the Lord has made." This is our reality. We did not make the sun come up this morning. We could not prevent the sun from coming up this morning. The fact that today exists is totally outside of our control or influence. How it all happened is beyond our comprehension. This is a bit of a simplification of the psychological concept, but I think it is helpful to understand that we may have little control over the circumstances of our lives, but we have great control over our ability to choose how we will respond to the circumstances.

"We WILL rejoice." (emphasis mine).

I choose to see this day as a gift from God. I choose to laugh. I choose to hope. I choose to encourage. I choose to bless. I choose to endure. I choose to love. I choose to be amazing.

have hot coffee and ice-cold cokes in the cooler for 50 cents,” said Sparks. “Everyone’s welcome to come and listen, to visit, and to sing a tune.”

There’s no charge to come and listen, and the desserts are free. They do ask a little something for the soft drinks and coffee, and a can might get passed around for donations “just to help keep the lights on.”

The Azle Opry was a laundromat in a previous incarnation, owned by Marshall and Vonnie Holmes.

According to some handwritten notes by Linda Wilson, one of the Holmes’ daughters, it was “on a cold Friday evening in 1963,” when Marshall and a few of his “music-loving friends gathered in a corner of the Coin-O-Mat to play country music.”

Last Friday evening, the parking lot was already filling in an hour before the 7 o’clock showtime.

“The regulars will get here early to make sure they get ‘their’ spot,” said Sparks. Getting in before the music starts means having time to socialize.

When you’re at the Azle Opry, you’ll probably meet plenty of the regulars who have been attending since the beginning.

Lydia remembers going as a child, when the venue was still lined with washers and dryers.

“Mom would be doing laundry while Daddy played,” Lydia said.

Jackie, Lydia’s mom, said she has been coming ever since 1976, even after her husband of 66 years passed away.

“We were engaged from the time I was six years old,” Jackie said. “Told him he’d have to wait until I was big enough though, and we got married when I was 17.”

Jackie described herself as “mean as the dickens,” but as the band played, you

could see a smile on her face and her foot tapping along to the beat.

The venue had to undergo repairs in the last few months following the Ash Creek flood, which filled the Opry with 10 inches of mud and water. The carpeting and stage were repaired just in time for the reopening on July 9.

The house band, a group of “mostly retired musicians,” comes together every Friday night to entertain the crowd at the Opry. The musicians play songs for the first hour and then singers are invited to sign up to perform with the band for the rest of the night.

When Marshall passed away eight years ago, his family and friends wanted to keep his legacy alive, and so the band at the Azle Opry plays on.

“We piddle and pick,” says friend Jerry Pierce. “Just the way Marshall wanted it.”

# Workforce commission announces job surge

The Texas Workforce Commission released June employment figures that showed Texas employers (texaslmi.com/) added nearly 56,000 jobs in June, while the unemployment rate dropped to 6.5%. "The Texas economy is booming," Gov. Greg Abbott said in a statement. "Businesses are investing in the Lone Star State at a record pace because we've built a framework that allows free enterprise to flourish and hardworking Texans to prosper." TWC's latest statistics show that the leisure and hospitality industry led all others in job growth, adding more than 19,000 jobs. Education and health services employment ranked second, adding 9,500 jobs in June.

## TEXAS DEMOCRATS STILL HOLED UP IN D.C.

More than 50 Texas Democratic legislators remain holed up in a Washington, D.C. hotel, blocking an effort by Republicans to pass more restrictive vot-

ing laws during the present special session since state law requires at least 100 reps to have a quorum. The legislators have been meeting with national Democratic leaders, such as Vice President Kamala Harris, but also dealing with an outbreak of COVID-19 among its members, according to KUT. At least a half dozen legislators, who say they were already vaccinated, have tested positive for the virus while in the nation's capital. The legislators are pushing for federal voting legislation, called the For the People Act, which has already passed the U.S. House but remains bottled up in the Senate. Without changes to the Senate filibuster rule, passage seems unlikely.

The special session in Austin ends Aug. 7, but Abbott has vowed to call another one if the Democrats remain absent, effectively stopping any legislation from passing.

## PUC, ERCOT UPDATE CONSUMERS ON GRID RELIABILITY

In a joint press conference last Thursday, the chairman of the Public Utility Commission and the interim CEO of the Electric Reliability Council of Texas outlined steps their organizations are taking to improve electric grid reliability during the dog days of summer. The PUC oversees ERCOT, which is responsible for maintaining the electric grid. ERCOT has drawn

heat after the widespread blackouts during the February winter storm, and subsequently pleading for less energy consumption during an early summer heat wave. "We expect there is sufficient generation to meet summer 2021 electric demand; however, there may be times when we will call on customers to conserve just as other grid operators across the country and around the world do. It's just another tool in the toolbox," Brad Jones, ERCOT interim CEO, said. "In response to a conservation notice, Texans may need to take some simple steps for a limited duration - such as doing laundry in the morning or running the pool pump at night instead of the afternoon - to ensure grid reliability." Abbott recently issued executive orders directing the PUC and ERCOT to improve grid reliability. Critics say the measures passed in the last regular session to address the issue fall short of what is needed to ensure another grid failure doesn't

occur.

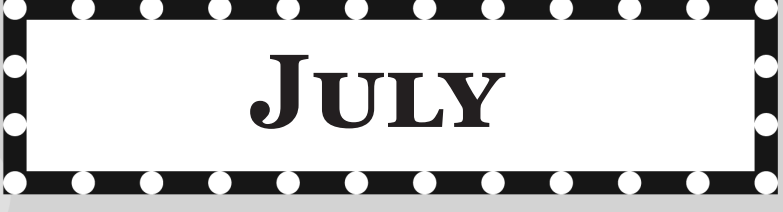
## AS CASES RISE, NEW POP-UP VACCINE SITES ANNOUNCED

COVID-19 cases and hospitalizations are on the rise again in Texas, largely spurred by the highly contagious delta variant. The Texas Department of State Health Services is again hitting the road to encourage folks to get vaccinated. Rates of those who are fully inoculated continue to lag, particularly in younger populations. DSHS will hold 18 pop-up events at Walmart locations across the state to talk with parents and families about the importance of vaccination for younger Texans as they prepare for next school year and as the Delta variant spreads more widely in Texas. The DSHS pop-ups last four hours each day and will travel around the state through the first week of August. The events feature a 16-foot video wall, a "Take the Shot" basketball game, and free frozen treats.

COVID-19 cases the past week in Texas continue to rise sharply, up 60% from the previous week, when cases nearly doubled. A total of 36,451 cases were reported by the Coronavirus Resource Center at Johns Hopkins University along with 190 deaths, flat compared to the previous week. However, hospitalizations continue to spike, with DSHS reporting 4,137 lab-confirmed COVID-19 patients in Texas, up more than 30 percent from the previous week. The number of Texans fully vaccinated rose slightly to 12.51 million, about 43 percent of the state's population. As the delta variant spreads, the state's positivity rate has exceeded 10% for the first time since February.

## Azle band marches through the heat

Earning five minutes in “Antarctica” is a big deal when it’s July in Azle, a heat spell has settled over the area and summer band camp has begun.

“I hope we get to Antarctica,” said Savannah Wambold, a freshman flutist in the Hornets marching band.

Antarctica is what band members refer to the collection of tents that offer shade, fans, misting sprayers and cold water.

“We’re keeping a close eye on the kids,” said Band Director Aaron Martin. “They are a little out of shape and not used to being out in the heat. We’ve got the tents set up for them to get out of the sun.”

Close to 100 kids were lined up and holding their instruments while standing on the hot pavement at an Azle High School parking lot. They practiced holding their instruments the right way, standing still and erect and then taking their first step on a routine. Martin told them they would go through everything once more, and the section that did the best would earn five minutes of rest and relaxation in Antarctica.

Wambold’s section didn’t win, but she and the others applauded for the kids that did – the euphonium players. The winners hustled over to the tents, sat down in the shade, let the misters blast them with a cold spritz and chatted about their summers.

Jhonathan Carmane, a senior euphonium player, has marched with the band since sixth grade. Back then, he was told he had to take a music-related class and chose band over choir. Music seeped into his blood that year, and he forged deep relationships with other band members.

“When I went into high school, it started to become like a second family,” he said. “Then, at times, it even became like a first family more than a second family. Our section is very much family oriented.”

He and his buddies will

log long days this summer while preparing for the upcoming football and contest season. They practice from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. each day this week and go longer still – 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. -- beginning next week.

Being in band is more than blowing a horn, Carmane said.

“It teaches you how to build confidence,” he said. “It teaches you how to be comfortable being uncomfortable. You get to have fun. You get to spend time with your friends and have a good time.”

Anyone who ever wondered what a band contributes to football games found out during last year’s pandemic-plagued year. Social distancing and other measures meant some games were held without the band in attendance. The difference was evident.

“I’ve heard plenty of football moms who are diehard football fans say it’s nothing without the band, just as if it would be nothing without the football team,” Carmane said. “Without the band, it’s very boring. We saw a glimpse of that through COVID last year. When the band wouldn’t be here, it would be a completely different atmosphere. When the band joins in, it changes everything for the better.”

As he spoke, Carmane checked his watch continuously. Time was ticking on his five minutes in Antarctica, and he didn’t want to be late returning to the parking lot to continue practice.

Martin, the director, was as eager as the kids to practice again after a summer break. This year’s contest routine is called The Road Not Taken, based on the Robert Frost poem.

“It’s a cool show,” he said. “We’ve been working on this design for a year and a half now, and we are really excited to get it on the field.”

There is plenty of work to be done, but, with temperatures edging toward 100 degrees for the foreseeable future, Martin and his staff told the kids repeatedly to grab shade and water if they felt woozy.

They will practice in the

sun during the mornings and move inside after lunch.

“Next week, we start the long days,” he said. “It’s a pretty big commitment. There are a lot of hours. A lot of blood, sweat and tears.”

Band members earn relationships and habits that can last a lifetime, he said.

“They get a family,” Martin said. “This group of peo-

ple takes care of each other. If you are struggling with classes or having personal problems, there is always somebody here who will take care of you, whether it is a director or another student. The things they are working on here – time management and the dedication to seeing something through — is something they can

take with them to any career they will get into.”

In football, coaches aren’t trying to groom professional athletes. Sure, some high school players make it to that level, but the goal is to prepare kids for adulthood.

“The big thing about these activities is teaching a skill-set of being able to see something through to completion

and learning how to overcome adversity, something all these guys have learned in the past year and a half,” Martin said. “We’ve had adversity every step of the way with COVID, and they have overcome and overcome. This is just one more step in our process.”

# This Hollywood memoir is not about Tinseltown

Trejo knew Charles Manson. He worked as an inmate firefighter. Because he often ensured that vulnerable inmates weren't subject to violence or predation, guards came to appreciate him, and that led Trejo to better prison jobs. One of the last had placed him near where contraband entered the prison and soon he "ran the heroin bag..."

Just hold on. Wait it out, don't quit, they say. Hang on, don't let go. Better times are coming. Just hold on – or, as in the new memoir, "Trejo: My Life of Crime, Redemption, and Hollywood" by Danny Trejo with Donal Logue, sometimes, you have to just let go.

The first time he went to jail, Danny Trejo was ten years old.

Within two years, he "was a regular at juvenile hall"; by the time he was in his early 20s, he'd spent time in several hard-core facilities, Soledad, Folsom, Alcatraz. He'd been "locked up, in and out but mostly in, since 1956" and he figured he'd die in prison.

Born at the tail-end of World War II, Trejo was taken from his birth mother as a toddler because his father thought she was neglecting the boy. Trejo's father taught him to be stoic, to stand up for himself, and to step up when someone needed to; his beloved Uncle Gilbert showed him how to survive the streets, and prison.

Gilbert also taught him to box, which allowed Trejo to gain respect behind bars.

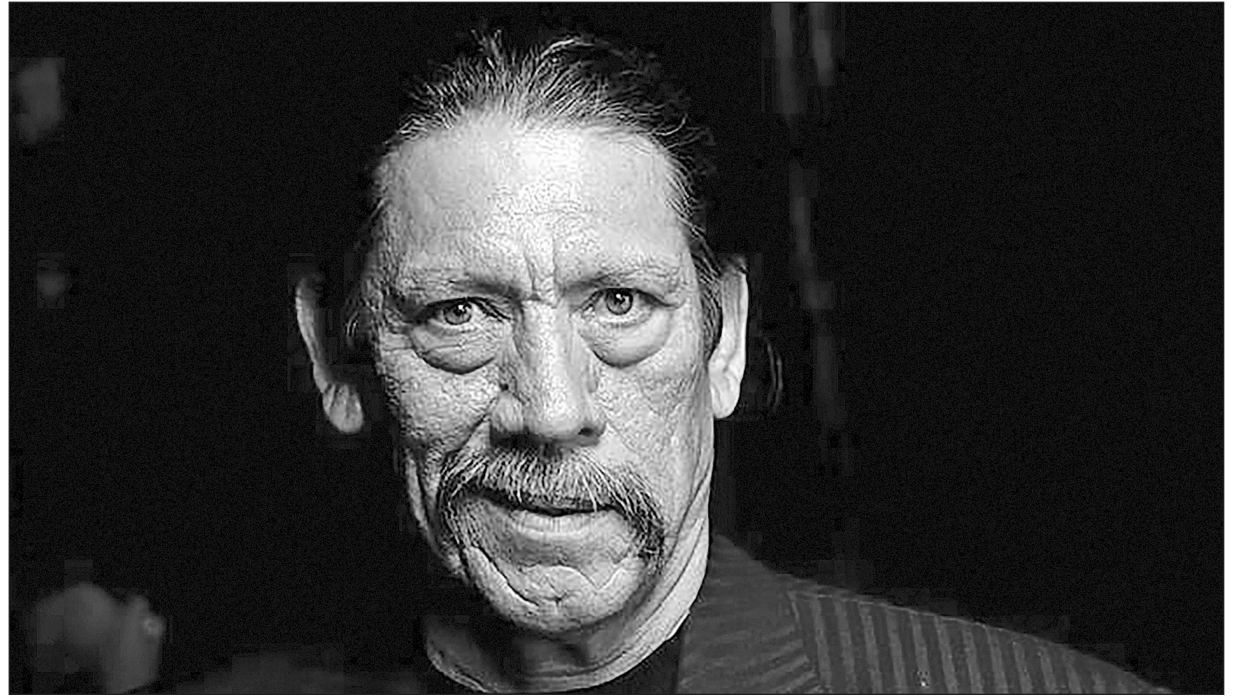
You needed something? He could get it.

And then he lost that job in a fight that almost put him on Death Row. Heroin, pills, alcohol, weed, machismo, he couldn't do it anymore and he says he began to talk to God, promising to help others if He saved him. Once released, that's what Trejo did: he gave up alcohol and drugs and began counseling other addicts and those on their way to prison.

And one of them mentioned that he was making money as a movie extra...

As Big Hollywood Memoirs go, "Trejo" is a very pleasant surprise, starting with the fact that most of it isn't about Hollywood.

Indeed, author Danny Trejo (with Donal Logue) places nearly the entire first half of his book in prison, among hardened crimi-

nals, gang members, killers, and addicts, while partly weaving his early life into his tales behind bars. Trejo doesn't hide anything in his time of crime, nor does he minimize any of the impacts his family had on it, an honesty that allows for a curious trust between reader and writers.

But this is not a True Crime sto-

ry. Trejo and Logue switch their tale at the point where Trejo almost accidentally becomes a Hollywood extra, and the tone quickly changes: darkness lifts from the narrative and it's almost... happy. By then, readers will be ready for that; add the lack of attention-grabbing name-dropping, and you'll be happy, too.

This may be the most unique and gracious memoir you'll read this summer, so check it out. "Trejo" is a treasure, one you'll hold on to.



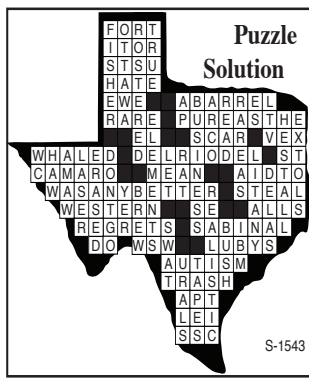
