Azle Opry back to 'piddle and pick'

After 16 months of silence, music is playing at Azle Opry again.

"We have been looking forward to getting back together so here it is," Roland Sparks said in a Facebook post.

The Opry closed its doors at the start of the pandemic, and it has been quiet ever since.

The first night back in action was July 9, where the regulars held a Fourth of July celebration of music and free food and drinks for attendees.

"We had quite the crowd," Sparks said.

The music will keep on playing every Friday night starting at 7 p.m. at the "old coin-o-matic" at 125 Stewart St., just before you get to Ash Creek Baptist Church.

If you are a fan of gospel and classic country, a hot cup of coffee and a slice of cake, then the Opry is the place to spend your Friday nights.

First off let's recognize the

science, it is not theory. Genetic research has been going on for quiet some time. Gregor Mendel, a Moravian genetic inheritance research in 1865 and 1866 using pea plants. Just as a sidenote, since Mendel was doing his research in Moravia, which is now considered a part of the Czech Republic, I'm not sure what kind of peas he he had been in our Southern states, he would have used Blackeyed peas.

There was genetic research being done before Mendel, but he is probably genetic researcher. So at least since 1865 there has been testing and experimentation happening in the field of genetics and in 99.9% of the cases it has been positive research for improvements in our world.

So again, when genetics and research are paired up into one phrase, stay calm and pay attention.

Ok, at this point you have probably figured out the direction that I'm going with this topic. Next week we'll spend our time visiting about the positives and very few negatives of genetic research, testing and actual real life uses in the Agricultural sector.

"No political agenda, no religious agenda ... I'm here for anyone," Norman said, as he waved at a passing car with horns blaring on the corner of Speer Avenue and Central Drive.

Not long after that, a woman in a van pulled up, rolled down her window and shouted from across the street, "Thank you! You're awesome!"

Norman, a Springtown resident, began listening in May. It all began as an idea from his grandson Kameron.

Last year, after going through some personal stuff, Norman realized he had nobody to talk to.

"People I thought would reach out didn't," he said. "I've always gone to church here in Azle. Not one person reached out."

Norman, who is raising his grandson, said the 15-year-old thought "it was sad" that nobody came to lend an ear.



AS CASES RISE, NEW sequently pleading for less **POP-UP VACCINE SITES**

COVID-19 cases and hospitalizations are on the rise again in Texas, largely spurred by the highly contagious delta variant. The Texas Department of State Health Services is again hitting the road to encourage folks to get vaccinated. Rates of those who are fully inoculated continue to lag, particularly in younger populations. DSHS will hold 18 pop-up events at Walmart locations across the state to talk with parents and families about the importance of vaccination for younger Texans as they prepare for next school year and as the Delta variant spreads more widely in Texas. The DSHS pop-ups last four hours each day and will travel around the state through the first week of August. The events feature a 16-foot video wall, a "Take the Shot" basketball game, and free frozen treats.


COVID-19 cases the past week in Texas continue to rise sharply, up 60% from the previous week, when cases nearly doubled. A total of 36,451 cases were reported by the Coronavirus Resource Center at Johns Hopkins University along with 190 deaths, flat compared to the previous week. However, hospitalizations continue to spike, with DSHS reporting 4,137 lab-confirmed COVID-19 patients in Texas, up more than 30 percent from the previous week. The number of Texans fully vaccinated rose slightly to 12.51 million, about 43 percent of the state's population. As the delta variant spreads, the state's positivity rate has exceeded 10% for the first time since February.

BOOK REVIEW This Hollywood memoir is not about Tinseltown

Within two years, he "was a regular at juvenile hall"; by the time he was in his early 20s, he'd spent time in several hard-core facilities, Soledad, Folsom, Alcatraz. He'd been "locked up, in and out but if He saved him. Once released, mostly in, since 1956" and he figured he'd die in prison.

Born at the tail-end of World War II, Trejo was taken from his birth mother as a toddler because his father thought she was neglecting the boy. Trejo's father taught him to be stoic, to stand up for himself, and to step up when someone needed to; his beloved Uncle Gilbert showed him how to survive the streets, and prison.

Gilbert also taught him to box, which allowed Trejo to gain respect behind bars.

Trejo knew Charles Manson. He worked as an inmate firefighter. Because he often ensured that vulnerable inmates weren't subject to violence or predation, guards came to appreciate him, and that led Trejo to better prison jobs. One of the last had placed him near where contraband entered the prison and soon he "ran the heroin bag..."



And then he lost that job in a fight that almost put him on Death Row. Heroin, pills, alcohol, weed, machismo, he couldn't do it anymore and he says he began to talk to God, promising to help others that's what Trejo did: he gave up alcohol and drugs and began counseling other addicts and those on their way to prison.

And one of them mentioned that he was making money as a movie extra...
