# Tommy's Shop celebrates 45 years

Tommy Francks was just 15 years old when he began planning to open his own auto repair shop. His entrepreneurial spirit was passed down from both parents.

Francks' father Charles owned Francks Grocery and Market, which was located on the same property where Tommy's Shop stands today, and mother Dorothy owned Francks Florist, which was also located on the property before moving to Lake Worth when Tommy was a young child.

On June 1, 1976, 19-yearold Francks bought Tommy's Bug Shop from Tommy Tarter, then located at the intersection of Tenderfoot Trail and Jacksboro Highway. Shortly after that, he changed the name to Tommy's Shop since "Bug" was copyrighted by Volkswagen in Germany.

Two years later, Tommy's Shop needed more room, and Francks was eager to stop renting. He made plans and built the new shop on the Francks' Homestead property. In 1999, when the highway expansion began, the shop was moved back to where it sits today at 10901 Jacksboro Hwy.
