BASEBALL

Azle Baseball Booster Baseball Camp is for any incoming 2nd to 9th grade student. The camp runs Tuesday, June 1 through Thursday, June 3, with a session for incoming 2nd through 5th graders from 8 to 10 a.m., and incoming 6th through 9th graders 10:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. The camp is at the Azle High School baseball facility, and instructors will be AHS baseball coaches.

Flash floods cause mess at sheriff's department, families seek help as water rises

Heavy rainfall wreaked havoc in Parker County on Monday, flooding the sheriff's department and causing one neighborhood to call for help as rising water surrounded their homes. Parker County's Emergency

Management Coordinator Sean Hughes said emergency personnel had to retrieve three families off of Bethel Road due to the rising water. "They were trapped and couldn't get out of their properties," Hughes said. No injuries were reported dur-

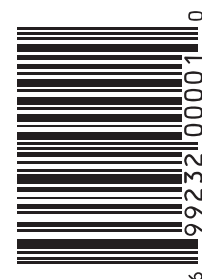

Azle library reduces fines, prepares for summer reading fun

The Azle Memorial Library has reduced the overdue fine rates as well as the maximum per-item fine for patrons effective May 5.

The old fines for items were 10 cents a day for books and audiobooks with a max fine of \$5 per item. Fines for DVDs and Blu-Rays and Binge Boxes were \$1 a day and \$5 maximum. Now, the fines for books, audiobooks and DVD/Blu-Ray discs are all 10 cents per day with a maximum fine of \$1 per item. The overdue fines for Binge Boxes remain at \$1 per day with a max of \$5 per box.

BINGE BOXES

The library introduced Binge Boxes late last year. Library director Curren McLane says the boxes are "the perfect way to check out multiple movies and TV seasons all at once."

The Azle Library current-

ly offers patrons around 50 custom Binge Boxes containing six to eight DVDs. Each box has its own common movie theme (i.e. horror, comedy) or one or two seasons of a popular TV series.

Adult cardholders can check out one box at a time for a two-week period. Binge Boxes can't be renewed.

"We hope library users will enjoy this newest, fun collection!"

SUMMER READING

The summer reading program at the library, Reading Colors Your World, is running from June 7 to July 23. Patrons can begin picking up their reading logs on June 1.

The summer reading program is free for readers of all ages. There will be free take-away crafts for all ages, virtual summer programming, and prizes.

"Reading is a great way to have fun and keep brains ac-

McLane. "That's why we offer the Summer Reading Club for children, teens and adults! It's our way of encouraging reading so that children and teens keep up their reading skills throughout the summer and are ready for school in the fall.

Young readers ages 5-10 will also have a chance to write letters to their favorite

storybook characters and receive a reply letter back in the mail.

ing the incident.

The flash flood also caused the Parker County Sheriff's Department building to flood, with water deep enough to cover tires of deputy vehicles in the parking lot. Water also seeped into the hallway and into the county's server room.

Public Information Officer Danie Huffman said rising water came in from the north side of the building, causing the computer-aided dispatch (CAD) system and landlines to go down for about an hour.

"The 911 system was not affected," Huffman said.

County employees assisted with immediate water removal until clean-up crews could arrive, and preventative measures were taken for more rain expected.

Huffman said damages appear to be minimal.

Parker County Sheriff Russ Authier said "it was an unprecedented event which

we have not seen before."

Jason Godwin, meteorologist with the National Weather Service (NWS) Fort Worth, said rainfall in Parker County during a 24-hour period May 24 totaled 2 to 5 inches in Weatherford, a lot more than Springtown and Azle received .75 inches and .84 inches respectively.

For the month, as of 6 a.m. May 25, Parker County received 4 to 7 inches county-wide, with 7.08 inches reported from the NWS Cooperative Observer Program.

"That is significant," Godwin said.

Long term, the average is 4.73 inches for May.

"We are well above normal for the month of May," Godwin said.

Record rainfall for Parker County in May include 16.38 inches in 1957, 12.44 inches in 2015, and 10.85 in 2019.

Going forward Thursday and beyond, rain and

thunderstorms remain in the forecast "but nothing suggests a major washout," Godwin said.

"We expect this in late

spring and early summer," Godwin said. "Some can get heavy rainfall, but not everybody. These events can drop 1 to 2 inches pretty quickly."

Deadlines for Filing Proofs of Claim. On May 5, 2021 the Court entered an order [Dkt. No. 515] the ("Bar Date Order") establishing certain dates by which parties holding prepetition claims against Brazos Electric Power Cooperative, Inc. (the "Debtor") must file proofs of claim, including requests for payment pursuant to section 503(b)(9) of the Bankruptcy Code ("Proofs of Claim").

The Bar Dates. Pursuant to the Bar Date Order, all entities (except tort claimants and governmental units), including individuals, partnerships, estates, and trusts that have a claim or potential claim against the Debtor that arose prior to March 1, 2021, no matter how remote or contingent such right to payment or equitable remedy may be, including requests for payment under section 503(b)(9) of the Bankruptcy Code, MUST FILE A PROOF OF CLAIM on or before **June 15, 2021** (the "General Claims Bar Date"). All tort claimants that assert a tort claim or potential tort claim against the Debtor that arose prior to March 1, 2021, no matter how remote or contingent such right to payment or equitable remedy may be, MUST FILE A PROOF OF CLAIM on or before **August 5, 2021** (the "Tort Claims Bar Date"). Governmental entities that have a claim or potential claim against the Debtor that arose prior to March 1, 2021, no matter how remote or contingent such right to payment or equitable remedy may be, MUST FILE A PROOF OF CLAIM on or before **September 3, 2021** (the "Governmental Bar Date"). All entities holding claims arising from the Debtor's rejection of executory contracts or unexpired leases must file Proofs of Claim by the date that is the later of (a) the General Claims Bar Date or the Governmental Bar Date, as applicable, and (b) the date that is thirty (30) days following entry of the order approving the Debtor's rejection of the applicable executory contract or unexpired lease (such later date, the "Rejection Damages Bar Date"). In the event that the Debtor amends its Schedules, all entities holding claims affected by such amendment must file Proofs of Claims by the date that is the later of (a) the General Claims Bar Date or the Governmental Bar Date, as applicable, and (b) the date that is thirty (30) days from the date on which the Debtor mails notice of the amendment to the Schedules (the "Amended Schedules Bar Date").

Contents of Proofs of Claim. Each Proof of Claim must: (i) be written in legible English; (ii) include a claim amount denominated in United States dollars; (iii) conform substantially with the Proof of Claim Form approved by this Court; and (iv) be signed by the claimant or by an authorized agent or legal representative of the claimant on behalf of the claimant, whether such signature is an electronic signature or is ink.

Section 503(b)(9) Claim. Any Proof of Claim asserting a claim entitled to priority under section 503(b)(9) of the Bankruptcy Code must also: (i) include the value of the goods delivered to and received by the Debtor in the 20 days prior to the Petition Date; (ii) attach any documentation identifying the particular invoices for which the 503(b)(9) claim is being asserted; and (iii) attach documentation of any reclamation demand made to the Debtor under section 546(c) of the Bankruptcy Code (if applicable).

Electronic Signatures Permitted. Only original Proofs of Claim signed electronically by the claimant or an authorized agent or legal representative of the claimant may be deemed acceptable for purposes of claims administration. Copies of Proofs of Claim, or Proofs of Claim sent by facsimile or electronic mail will not be accepted.

Supporting Documentation. Each non-tort claimant Proof of Claim must include supporting documentation, to the extent required by Bankruptcy Rules 3001(c) and 3001(d). If, however, such documentation is voluminous, such Proof of Claim may include a summary of such documentation or an explanation as to why such documentation is not available; provided however that such information must be made available on request by the Debtor, Committee or U.S. Trustee. Each tort claimant Proof of Claim must attach a signed statement setting forth a basis for the claim and nature of the injury.

Timely Service. Proofs of Claim will be deemed filed when filing via PACER is completed or when actually received by the Claims Agent. Any facsimile or electronic mail submissions will not be accepted and will not be deemed filed until a claim is submitted by one of the methods described above.

Receipt of Service. Claimants submitting a Proof of Claim through non-electronic means wishing to receive acknowledgment that their Proofs of Claim were received by the Claims Agent must submit (i) a copy of the Proof of Claim Form (in addition to the original Proof of Claim Form sent to the Claims Agent) and (ii) a self-addressed, stamped envelope.

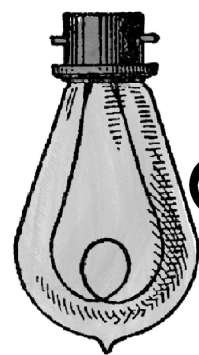

Special session coming this fall

Texas lawmakers will adjourn the regular session on Monday — Memorial Day — but Gov. Greg Abbott has already indicated he will call a special session in the fall to grapple with redistricting after detailed census results are finally released.

Last week, Abbott told lawmakers he would put them in charge of deciding how to spend nearly \$16 billion in federal money the state received for COVID-19 recovery efforts. During the first two rounds of stimulus funding, Abbott decided how the money would be spent, which angered some legislators.

The special session comes just months before the 2022 primaries, with Abbott, Lt. Gov. Dan Patrick, Attorney General Ken Paxton and Comptroller Glenn Hegar all planning to seek re-election.

That raises the possibility of other topics being added to the special session that could appeal to the governor's base, according to the San Antonio Express-News. Abbott has drawn one primary opponent, former state Sen. Don Huffines.

MASK MANDATES LARGELY A THING OF THE PAST IN TEXAS

Abbott last week issued an executive order banning all government and public entities from mandating the wearing of masks. The order went into effect May 21,

except for public schools, which can require masks until June 4.

Local governments or officials can be fined up to \$1,000 for requiring the wearing of masks, although businesses can still require them. Most large retailers, such as Walmart, Costco and Target, announced they were ending mask requirements.

However, state-supported living centers, government owned or operated hospitals, state prison juvenile justice facilities and county and municipal jails are exempt from Abbott's order and can still require masks be worn.

A DAY IN TEXAS WITH NO COVID-19 DEATHS

For the first time since March 21, 2020, the state's Department of State Health Services on Sunday, May 16, said no deaths related to COVID-19 were reported.

The milestone was noted by Abbott and others, though celebrations were tempered at least among some, the Houston Chronicle reported. The hiatus was short-lived, however, as DSHS reported 23 new deaths the following day.

The number of Texans hospitalized who are COVID-19 patients is at its lowest level since last June, according to DSHS, with 2,070 cases that were lab confirmed as of Sunday.

The number of new cases in the past week in Texas, as

reported by the Coronavirus Resource Center at Johns Hopkins University, stood at 12,290, down 17.5 percent from the previous week and continuing the steady decline statewide. A total of 269 deaths were recorded statewide for the same time frame.

Meanwhile, the number of Texans who are fully vaccinated reached nearly 9.8 million.

DROUGHT CONDITIONS EASING UNDER WIDESPREAD STORMS

Much of the state has experienced a soggy May thus far, with widespread precipitation blanketing much of the eastern and central regions. As a result, drought

conditions have eased except in the Panhandle and West Texas and the counties around Laredo on the border.

The Texas Water Development Board reports a total of 44% of the state's area is now under moderate or worse drought conditions. By comparison, we reported on April 4 that drought conditions existed in more than two-thirds of the state.

TEXAS OPTS OUT OF FEDERAL JOBLESS ASSISTANCE PLAN

Abbott last week announced the state will no longer accept federal jobless assistance funds after June 26, including the extra \$300-per-week approved earlier this year by Congress.

The state is also leaving a federal assistance program that provides aid to self-employed and gig workers not normally covered by unemployment insurance. The move is intended to encourage people to return to work, as restaurants and other businesses say it is difficult to attract workers.

"The Texas economy is booming, and employers are hiring in communities throughout the state," Abbott said. "According to the Texas Workforce Commission, the number of job openings in Texas is almost identical to the number of Texans who are receiving unemployment benefits. That assessment does not include the volumi-

nous jobs that typically are not listed, like construction and restaurant jobs."

The state's jobless rate was 6.7% in April, according to the Texas Workforce Commission, down from the record high of 12.9% in April 2020.

SECRETARY OF STATE HUGHS TO STEP DOWN

Texas Secretary of State Ruth Ruggiero Hughs will step down at the end of May, she announced last week. Hughs was appointed by Abbott in August 2019. However, the Texas Senate never formally confirmed her nomination. Abbott will now be free to appoint a new secretary of state, who could be confirmed during the upcoming special session.

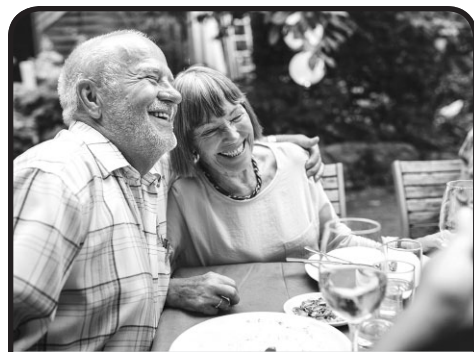

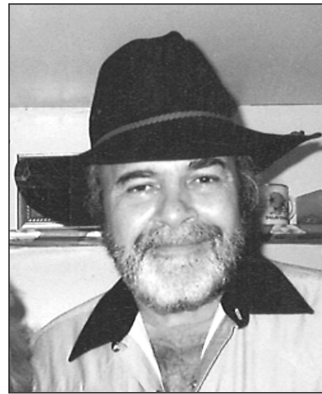

A Few Agricultural Facts

After retiring from the high school Agricultural Science classroom with thirty-four years of experience I still had the desire to pass along knowledge about Agriculture.

When the idea of writing this column surfaced, here was my answer, but instead of teaching high school students I would have the chance to share Agricultural knowledge with newspaper readers. What a great opportunity this has been.

As we start this week's column let's look at a few facts.

• Fact number one, according to the Survival Rule of 3 we as humans can survive without air for 3 minutes, 3 hours without shelter, 3 days without water and 3 weeks

without food. Keep in mind that these numbers can and will vary to a certain extent depending on the individual and the conditions that they are in.

Agriculture provides three of the items that figure into the Survival Rule of 3, those

being lumber to be used as materials for shelter; cotton, wool, linen and silk fibers along with leather to be made into clothing which is just another form of shelter and of course there's food. Honestly even though food is number four on the Rule of 3 list, it is most likely the first thing people think of when considering the importance of Agriculture. Let's also not forget Agriculture's contribution of fuel sources in the form of firewood and ethanol.

• Fact number two, Agricultural products cannot be produced just anywhere. Most of our Agricultural production is reliant on fertile, productive soils. These rich soils are essential in producing the seeds and other plant parts that are used directly by humans or indirectly as

feedstuffs for livestock and other animals in the production of meat, milk, wool, etc.

Many of the things that our productive soils are being used for today could be happening elsewhere on lower quality soils that are not suitable for Agriculture. Some of you may remember from a previous column that "just add more fertilizer" is not always the correct answer for "fixing" a soil. And there are some soils that cannot be fixed or made any more productive.

• Fact three, food and other essential Agricultural products DO NOT come from stores, they come through stores, but they originate from the hands and efforts of less than 2% of the U.S.A. population; the farmers, ranchers, beekeepers, feedlot operators, dairymen

along with hundreds, if not thousands of other types of Agriculturalists.

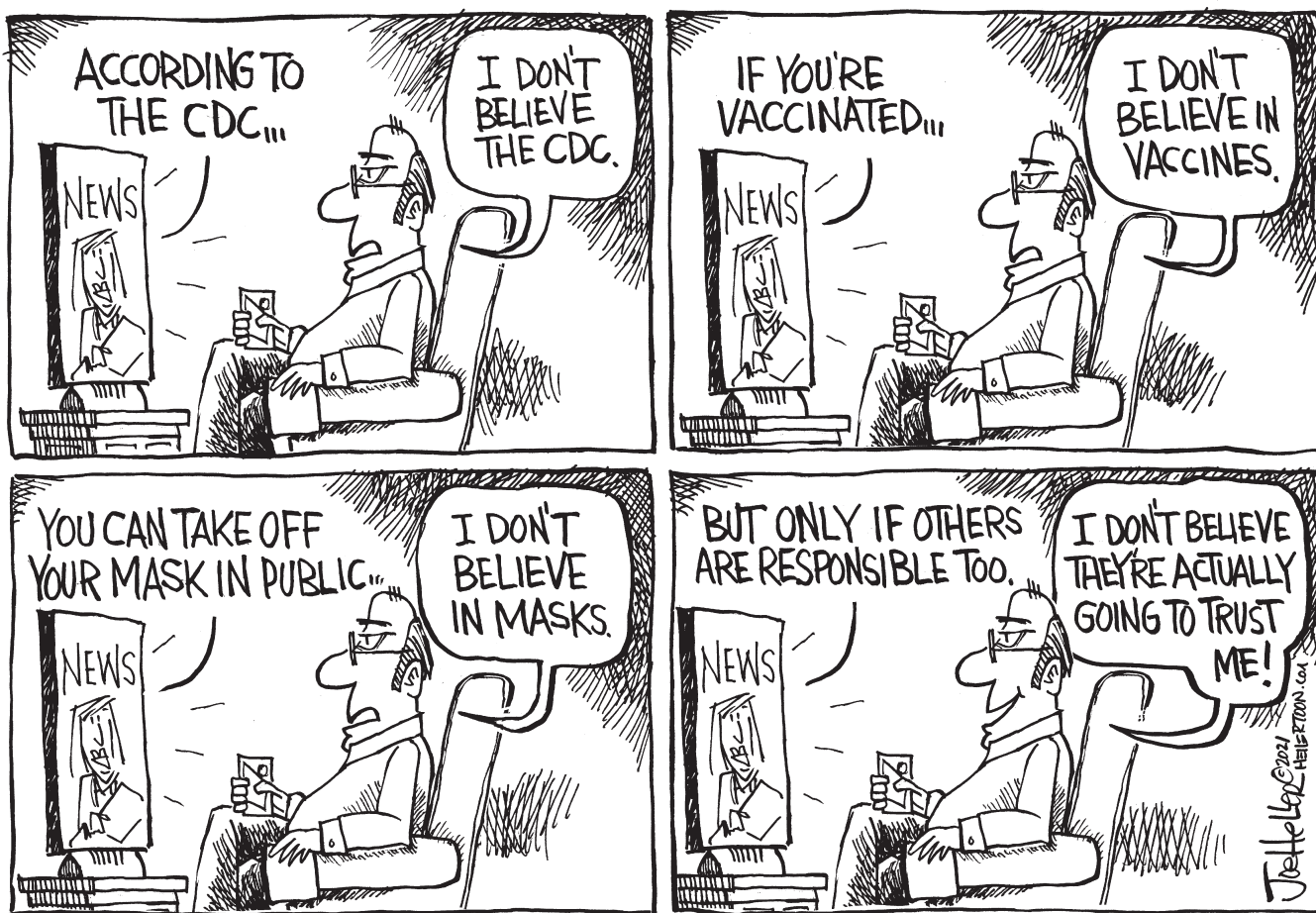
I do not mean to lessen the value and importance of the processors, transporters and merchants. In times of shortages, just going to the store to get more food is a weak answer supplied by many people. If the shortage is because of processing, transportation or marketing problems these things can usually be fixed or worked around. But if the lack of products on the shelf is a producer problem, that is something for which there usually is no quick fix.

So what are some of the reasons for producer problems? A few of them could be shortages of fuel for equipment, unusual weather patterns that can affect plant growth and/or livestock

health, shortages of fertilizer and seed, unusual livestock and plant diseases, insect and other predator invasions, equipment and parts shortages, a lack of available quality land, inflation, etc., etc.

If you will notice most of these problems are way beyond the control of the producer, the same as with many of the problems for processors, transporters and marketers of these products. However, overlooking or just not knowing that the producer is probably the most important step in providing our nation and a portion of the world with Agricultural products is a dangerous precedent. Keep in mind the adage: Knowledge is power.

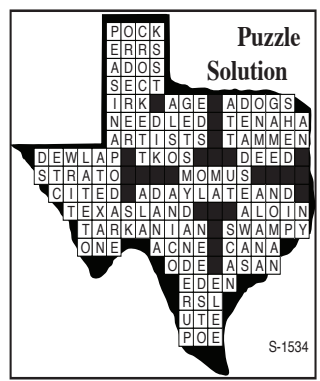

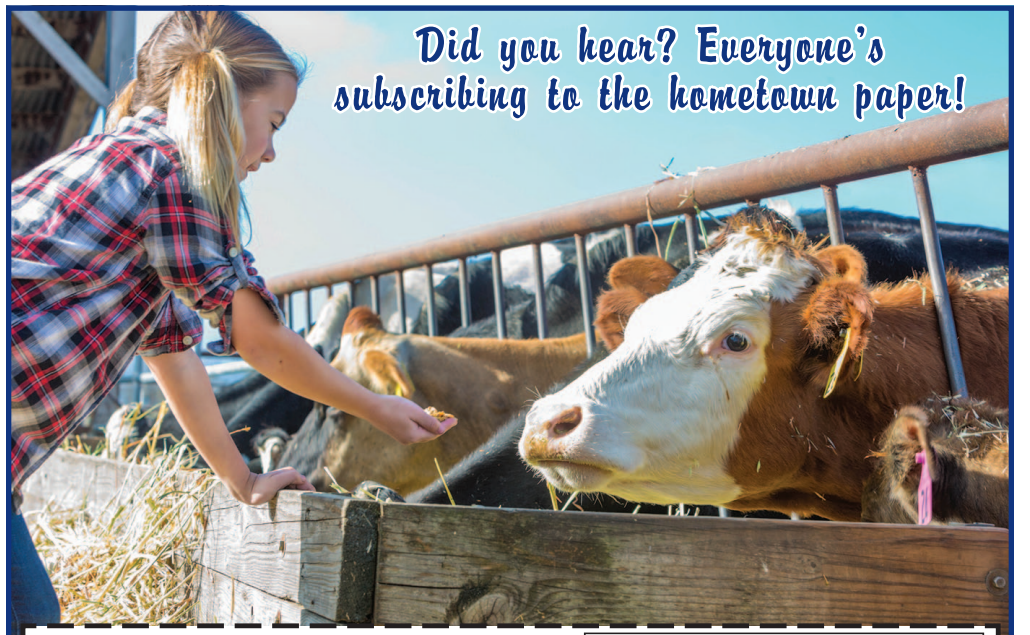
