Walnut Creek SUD moves forward on \$40 million bond sale

District to receive funds for infrastructure improvements on Oct. 18

SPRINGTOWN — Walnut Creek Special Utility District's board of directors recently took another step toward receiving millions of dollars to improve water infrastructure.

On Sept. 25, the board awarded the sale of \$40 million in bond funds to Wells Fargo. The district is expected to receive the money on Oct. 18. for the bond sale, and the bank Wells Fargo had the best bid with a 4.87% interest rate, Mark McLiney of SAMCO Capital Markets said during the board meeting.

Because of the district's good finances, McLiney said the district will have an extra \$800,000 in its construction account at a lower interest rate and with lower debt service payments. After fees, the district is expected to receive struction plus the additional \$800,000.

McLiney told the board the SUD is rated A-plus, which is not the highest rating available but still "well above the minimum investment grade."

"They talked about in the rating and in their analysis that we are pushing the upward bounds of that A-plus, meaning looking toward the

Tri-County Reporter urges community to "Fill the Pantry"

Local businesses challenged to donate staple foods to Community Caring Center

AZLE — During a leaner holiday season, Azle's Community Caring Center (CCC) wants to make sure families can still celebrate like they used to. In addition to the regular staples, the organization plans to give out Christmas boxes containing holiday necessities like canned sweet potatoes, cranberry sauce, and gravy to list a few. "We believe the holidays can be a stressful time for families financially and by providing everything needed for a holiday meal, we can offer some relief and spread a little holiday cheer," CCC Director Kristie Cooper said. "If we can provide one happy meal, that's one less thing they have to worry about. It's the perfect time of year to do that during the holiday season." Last year, the Azle News, now the Tri-County Reporter, encouraged local businesses and Azle area organizations to pledge a contribution to the center in an initiative known as Fill the Pantry. During an Oct. 3 chamber of commerce luncheon, the newspaper once again kicked off the challenge, calling on the Azle ISD, the Azle Police Department, the Azle Fire

Azle recognizes Domestic Violence Awareness Month

Future, Hope and Healing Center representatives and Azle Police speak on abuse in the community and what resources are available

AZLE — "Abuse is subtle; it's like a rattlesnake slithering through the grass," Future, Hope and Healing Center board member Kathy Rankin said. "You don't know it's there until you hear the sound."

October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month and advocates around the country are wearing purple in support of victims. At an Oct. 3 Azle Area Chamber of Commerce luncheon, leadership of the Future, Hope and Healing Center and Hope's Bazaar spoke out about domestic violence in the Azle community after being introduced with a proclamation from Mayor Pro Tem Randa Goode.

"It's important to be aware," Executive Director Sally Daniels said. "It's important to understand that domestic violence is not just a family issue, it's a community issue. People in the community are affected whether they believe they are or not. Domestic violence affects the whole community, and nobody is safe if our homes are not safe."

Azle Police Department's head of patrol operations, Lt. Dora Scudder, was invited by the organization to present statistics on the issue. According to Scudder, one in three women and one in four men in Texas will be victims of abuse by a partner. In Azle, the police have received 180 domestic violence calls since Jan. 1, 2020, amounting to 222 offenses and 162 victims.

"There are more offenses than calls because several instances result in multiple offenses," Scudder said. "There are fewer victims than calls because unfortunately, we often respond to the same households; 18% of our victims are related to two or more instances. When we compare our numbers from Jan.1 of last year to this year, we see an increase of 29%. We predict this trend will continue due to our increasing population. Domestic violence is real and unfortunately does exist in our community."

Due to the increase in domestic violence cases, the Azle Police Department established a domestic violence unit in March 2023. The unit has conducted 54 follow-up investigations since its inception. When victims are ready to leave their situation, Azle PD will then connect them to Future, Hope and Healing for resources and a way out.

"It's people like them that make a difference in our community," Scudder said of the Future, Hope and Healing staff. Scudder hopes the police will continue to further build their relationship with the center.

Future, Hope and Healing Center operates within and is funded by Hope's Bazaar at 141 W. Main Street in Azle. Jennifer Mello, manager at Hope's Bazaar, spoke on recent milestones at the resale shop and the mission of the non-profit. In September, the store set a new record with \$4,000 in monthly sales.

"One thing that is special about us is we each are survivors of domestic violence so there is a huge passion in our hearts for this mission to help others come out of the darkness," Mello said. "We have weekly sales, and accept donations that are free of rips, stains tears, and are good quality, name brand items. We want to make sure that when a client comes into our store we are clothing them with dignity and respect. There're many who come with absolutely nothing.'

Mello said those who leave Hope's Bazaar often do so with restored confidence and their heads held high. Mello hopes one day the organization can expand by building a women's shelter in Azle.

According to Daniels, a resale shop in Bridgeport that supports Wise Hope, a

women's shelter in Decatur, reports that as many as 50% of its clients come from Azle.

Future, Hope and Healing Center provides victims seeking to escape their abusers with the first month's rent, deposits, motel stays, free counseling and other essentials collected by the resale shop. This year, more than one-third of the nights of safe sleep provided by the center have occurred since mid-August.

"I will tell you, our numbers for the safe nights in somebody's own home, the deposits and utilities have doubled since our connection with the Azle Police Department's domestic violence unit," Daniels said.

On Oct. 19, Daniels will be speaking more about the issues surrounding domestic violence at Survivors Studio's Community Information Night. Survivors Studio is located on the side of The Edge Church at 1313 Southeast Parkway in Azle. 

Rep. Rogers condemns Defend Texas Liberty PAC president's meeting with white supremacist

AUSTIN — State Rep. Glenn Rogers, R-Graford, condemned conservative Texas activist Jonathan Stickland's recent meeting with a white supremacist.

The Texas Tribune reported that Stickland, who is president of Defend Texas Liberty Political Action Committee, hosted white supremacist Nick Fuentes and other conservative activists for several hours last week near Fort Worth. Defend Texas Liberty PAC is responsible for donating millions of dollars to high-profile Texas leaders.

Rogers encourages recipients of PAC's funding to return or donate money

Fuentes, 25, became promi- and "killing the globalists," nent on YouTube around the time of 2017's deadly neo-Nazi rally in Charlottesville, Virginia. Fuentes' transgressions include describing Adolf Hitler as "really (expletive) cool," questioning whether the Holocaust happened, fantasizing about marrying a 16-year-old, calling for a "holy war" against Jews, "Catholic Taliban rule"

and hoping things will get "uglier and a lot worse" for Jews and others.

Rogers also claimed Fuentes has referred to rape as "so not a big deal" and that Fuentes said Jim Crow laws were "better for them. It was better for us." Rogers condemned Stickland for meeting with Fuentes and said his willingness to con-

ference with Fuentes shows 'Stickland still falls right in line with those disgraceful and abhorrent views.'

"Antisemitism, salacious comments, and white-supremacist rhetoric have no place in our country and certainly no place in the GOP," Rogers said in a statement to The Tri-County Reporter. "It is extremely disappointing to see the reports that Jonathan Stickland, the president of Defend Texas Liberty PAC, met last week with known white-supremacist Nick Fuentes for several hours at his Pale Horse Strategies office in west Fort Worth." Rogers added, "While rockets fell on Israel, Stickland chose to court a Holocaust-

denying figure." The state representative for Parker, Palo Pinto and Stephens counties called for those who received money from Defend Texas Liberty to return the funds or give them to organizations that "work to repair the damage caused by Fuentes' caustic and antisemitic statements.' He also has demanded the Parker County Republican Party approve a resolution to denounce Nick Fuentes and

condemn Jonathan Stickland and Defend Texas Liberty for hosting him.

"Words are important and that is why I hope all fellow Republicans will join me in saying, 'We will not tolerate Nick Fuentes and his extremist views and we condemn anybody who would offer him a platform to spread his antisemitic and inflammatory rhetoric,'" Rogers said.

Rogers has not received money from Defend Texas Liberty PAC or its subsidiaries, according to his District Director Gary Norman.

TxDOT to widen FM 730

Texas Department of Transportation is proposing to reconstruct and widen Farm-to-Market Road 730 from State Highway 114 to

state Highway 199 in Wise and Tarrant counties.

The proposed project would widen FM 730 to a four-lane divided roadway from state Highway 114 to Reno Road and to a six-lane divided roadway from Reno Road to state Highway 199. The proposed project would also analyze current and proposed intersections, drainage, bicycle and pedestrian accommodations, two-way left turn lanes, and overall safety enhancements.

The proposed project could require additional right of way and potential displacements, pending further detailed design considerations. Relocation assistance is available for displaced persons and businesses. Information about the TxDOT Relocation Assistance Program and services and benefits for those displaced and other affected property owners, as well as information about the tentative schedule for right-of-way acquisition and construction, can be obtained from the TxDOT district office by calling 817-370-6950.

The proposed project would involve an action in the floodplain and construction in wetlands. Any environmental documentation or studies, any maps and drawings showing the project location and design, tentative construction schedules, and other information regarding the proposed project are on file and available for inspection by appointment Monday

through Friday between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. at TxDOT Fort Worth District Office, 2501 SW Loop 820, Fort Worth. Texas 76133. Project materials are also available online at the address listed above.

TxDOT will conduct an online virtual public meeting on the proposed project with an in-person option. The virtual public meeting will open at 8 a.m. Tuesday, Oct. 24 and close at 11:59 p.m. Wednesday, Nov. 8. To access the virtual public meeting, go to www.txdot.gov and search keyword "FM 730." The virtual meeting will consist of a pre-recorded video presentation with both audio and visual components. Project maps and materials will also be available online.

In an open-house format, in-person attendees will be able to view the pre-recorded video, review hard copies of project materials, ask questions of TxDOT staff and/or consultants and leave written comments. The in-person meeting will be from 5:30-7:30 p.m. Tuesday, Oct. 24 at Ash Creek Baptist Church, 301 S. Stewart St. in Azle.

If you do not have internet access, you may call Thomas Marquardt, P.E., at 817-370-6772 between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, to ask questions and access project materials during the project development process.

The public meeting will be conducted in English and

some materials will also be provided in Spanish. If you need an interpreter or document translator because English is not your primary language or you have difficulty communicating effectively in English, one will be provided to you. If you have a disability and need assistance, special arrangements can be made to accommodate most needs. If you need interpretation or translation services or you are a person with a disability who requires an accommodation to attend and participate in the public meeting, please contact Thomas Marquardt, P.E., at 817-370-6772 no later than 4 p.m., Wednesday, Oct. 18. AA Category, (it would) be something to keep striving for," McLiney said. "Y'all are doing very, very well financially.

McLiney said the bonds were sold with insurance, which moves the district's rating to AA. Bond insurance ensures payment to investors, even if that means loaning Walnut Creek a bond payment.

"They're putting their money where their mouth is," McLiney said. "They're guaranteeing it.'

The insurance fee for the SUD's \$40 million bond costs \$86,000, which McLiney pointed out is a good deal compared to other entities selling bonds.

"We don't have taxing ability, so this is just off your finances," he said about bond insurance fees. "They're looking at it and saying our credit is really good. We're

managing an asset that is making money, adding connections, operating very well. So, they're really impressed with that. I think it's more important to see what the insurance companies say because they're betting on vou. The rating agencies. they're just looking at your audit snapshot, interviewing, ment plant in about seven having a visit and moving on down the road."

Once the district receives the funds, the projects are expected to be sent out for bids in the latter part of November, said Bill Lohrke, senior project manager at E.S. & C.M., Inc.

"We'll be bidding those quite rapidly, sometimes two a day," Lohrke said.

There are close to 17 projects the bond will fund, Lohrke said. This includes adding a 4-million gallonsper-day filter to the water plant, improvements to boost the pump stations and a new booster pump station south of Springtown. The booster pump station will

have the booster pumps, storage tanks and an elevated tank.

"It will greatly expand this area south of Springtown," Lohrke said. "This is something that's really needed for the infrastructure."

The plan for the future is to build a new water treator eight years, but that will have to be included in another bond, Lohrke said.

"Right now, the treatment plant with these improvements will go to 12 million gallons a day," Lohrke said. "The new treatment plant we're looking at will go to 28 million (gallons) a day because of the growth."

The improvements made with the current bond will help prepare for the new plant, SUD general manager James Blackwood said. The general manager said he is glad to see the board move forward on the bond sale.

"I've got a lot of work to do," Blackwood said.

CCC is now serving over 1,300 families each month and the numbers are continuing to grow. This is a 30% increase in the number of families served in 2022.

Our annual budget is being stretched to keep food on our shelves!

Department and Pinnacle Bank to give and challenge others to donate.

"In addition to keeping our pantry shelves stocked and serving a higher number of families than ever before, we have set a goal of filling 1,000 Christmas Dinner Boxes," Cooper said. "This time of year is the busiest for us. It's also towards the end of our fiscal year so our operating budget is getting pretty lean. Fill the Pantry is the perfect timing to offer a little relief in our operating budget and help us meet our goals."

The biggest contributors from last year's initiative were the Azle ISD, Azle Christian School, Azle's fire and police departments and Pinnacle Bank. Last year during this period, between 11,000 and 12,000 pounds of food were collected. The CCC's biggest needs are canned goods, cereal, peanut butter, jelly and vegetables. Canned goods like vegetables, canned chicken, tuna, and pasta sauce are in especially high demand.

"That's why Fill the Pantry is so important because it's hitting some of the food pantry staple items that we need," Cooper said.

With food prices much higher than they were just a few years ago, the CCC has gone from serving an average of 500 families a month in 2019 to now serving an average of 1,250 families per month. Cooper said these numbers show no signs of stopping and they continue to hit new records month after month.

"Keep in mind the difference in cost of living, gas and groceries more than one year ago," Cooper said. "That's why we're seeing families who maybe could get by are no longer able to do that on their income."

Cooper believes community awareness and initiatives like Fill the Pantry are vital for the future of the center. "We want that competition

to happen between businesses and organizations across town and we want to get as much of the community involved as we can," Cooper said. "Azle is growing. We want it to be a fun interactive challenge on social media. Spreading awareness of our organization and our mission is one of my goals for the Caring Center. CCC has been part of this community for over 20 years. The Fill the Pantry Challenge is a great way to remind everyone that we're here whether they want to support us, volunteer with us, or refer someone to our services."

While this remains the busiest time of year for the center and the end of the fiscal year, Cooper remains hopeful that Azle businesses and the community will pull together to make sure families can continue to thrive this holiday season.

"We knew we could get Azle businesses behind it," Cooper said. "We knew that because Azle is such a wonderful, caring community this initiative would be supported. We had tremendous support last year and the goal is to make the challenge bigger every year."

GracePointe Church celebrates rededication of its ministry

PARKER COUNTY -GracePointe Church will celebrate a "rededication" of its ministry to the communities of Springtown, Azle and all "points of grace" in between on Sunday, Oct. 29, announced Pastor Tim McKeown, who came to the church earlier this year.

The church will mark the occasion with a sermon from its previous pastor, Dr. John Mann, who is the founding pastor of GracePointe Church. Two churches, Midway Baptist and LaJunta Baptist, merged in July 2019 to form GracePointe Church, located at 4110 East Hwy. 199, exactly five miles in between Azle and Springtown. 

Springtown voters prepare for another bond election

On Nov. 7, voters in Springtown will have a chance to vote once again on a \$120,780,000 bond referendum to benefit the Springtown Independent School District.

This bond election comes on the heels of a failed vote for the same amount that narrowly fell short in May.

If passed, the bond will provide funding to add seats for an additional 1,400 students by building a new middle school, converting the intermediate school into a fourth elementary campus, and creating a ninth-grade center in the current middle school.

The bond, if passed, will increase the interest and sinking tax rate (the tax rate levied by districts to pay for any bond debt that may have been issued to fund the construction of schools and facilities) by 17 cents per \$100 of property evaluation. However, with the recent tax decrease of 18 cents by trust-

ees, taxpayers will still pay a penny less than a year ago.

"SISD leadership has worked hard since May to determine the best way to move forward as our student enrollment continues to climb," board president Rick Beall said in a release on the school district website.

Beall noted the district has retained a new financial advisor, a new architect and a bond planning team. He's also hoping residents will take time to learn more about the projects proposed, tax rates, ballot language, and ask questions before casting their vote.

A town hall meeting was held Oct. 9.

Any Springtown ISD resident who is registered to vote may cast a ballot in this election. Voters will have from Oct. 23 to Nov. 3 to cast ballots during early voting.

CASA presents annual Kids on Canvas event

*Tarrant County chapter of foster child advocacy group to host annual auction and fundraiser on Oct.*19

Fort Worth – For 40 years, Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASAs) have worked to speak up for abused and neglected children in Tarrant County. When a home is deemed unsafe and a child must enter foster care, a judge may appoint a CASA volunteer to guide that child to a safe and permanent home as quickly as possible. CASAs engage in legislative advocacy, attend meetings with children, and fight for foster kids' best interests in court to ensure they don't slip through cracks within Child Protective Services and the legal system.

On Thursday, Oct. 19 CASA of Tarrant County will host its annual Kids on Canvas event from 5:30-8 p.m.

CASA Kids on Canvas is a one-night gallery event showcasing artwork created by children of all ages that are currently in foster care. Patrons can donate and bid on the artwork to have the opportunity to take the unique art pieces home with them. This event will help raise funds for critical advocacy and support services to the volunteers who advocate on behalf of the abused and neglected children in Tarrant County.

In 1977, a Seattle Superior Court Judge named David Soukup was concerned about trying to make decisions on behalf of abused and neglected children without enough information. He conceived the idea of appointing community volunteers to speak up for the best interests of

these children in court. He made a request for volunteers; 50 citizens responded, and that was the start of the CASA movement. In 1983, Judge Scott Moore of the 323rd Judicial District and other community volunteers formed the original steering committee that brought the CASA concept to Tarrant County.

Advocates claim children with a CASA have shorter

lengths of stay in foster care compared to children without a CASA, children are less likely to re-enter care once they find a permanent home and are more likely to pass all classes in school, less likely to have behavioral issues in school, and less likely to be expelled. The CASA organization estimates it saves taxpayers \$2,444,000 per year by reducing children's time spent in foster care. With an all-time high turnover rate for CPS caseworkers, according to The Texas Department of Family and Protective Services, and a critical shortage of beds and space in the foster care system, foster kids need more support than ever.

"Without the support of the community and all of our volunteers' hard work CASA would not exist," Amber Watson, a CASA Advocate said. "CASA is successful because of everyday people like you and me stepping up for the cause and being the change for our children who need us the most. We all can make a difference in our children's lives whether it be by volunteering, being a helping heart, donating, becoming a sponsor, or just by spreading the word about CASA."


The event will be held at the 4 Eleven venue on 411 S. Main



AZLE — For the last eight or nine months, 63-year-old Tammy Herrin has worked at Azle Café and despite constant car problems, has always made an effort to be there at her best.

"She bought a mini-van and has had nothing but trouble out of it," Sabrina Pyle, owner of Azle Café said. "It never starts and when it does start, it might run 10 miles per hour, but she wasn't using it as a crutch to get out of work. Yesterday, she called me and said, 'I'm sorry to do this to you, but I need a ride."

Pyle described how, even after installing a new engine, Herrin's car continued to be unreliable and how, through no fault of her own, she was unable to acquire the car's title. Even in the midst of so much bad luck, Pyle said Herrin never let it show and has been a Godsend for the shorthanded business.

"She's just positive and upbeat," Pyle said. "It doesn't matter how tired or stressed I am, she just reminds me, you got to have faith."

Pyle wanted Herrin's good deeds and faith to be repaid and after a visit by some restaurant regulars, found a way. Operation Texas Strong is a Weatherford-based nonprofit run by Bobby and Peggy Crutsinger. Since 2021, the organization has provided mobile homes, campers and recreational vehicles

to homeless military veterans in need. To date, the Crutsingers have provided shelter by giving away approximately 250 vehicles.

After recently receiving a 2005 Honda Civic from a veteran family in Aledo, the Crutsingers began looking for a recipient who might need it. By happenstance, the Crutsingers had made Azle Café their weekly breakfast spot and had developed rapport with Pyle.

When Pyle asked the couple if they knew anyone who might be able to solve Herrin's problem, they knew they had found their candidate. On Friday, Sept. 29, the Crutsingers and Pyle surprised Herrin by handing over the keys to the relatively low-mileage well-maintained Civic in the Azle Café parking lot. Herrin had been reaching out to other non-profits for assistance and transportation with little success but says **Operation Texas Strong's** donation came as a complete surprise.

"This is so awesome," Herrin said. "I don't know what to say, thank you very much! I never had anyone do anything like that for me. It's going to make me feel like I can stay alive a little bit longer, honestly. The other vehicle I had was just dying in the middle of the road. Every morning when I'd get in that vehicle I'd go, 'Lord keep me safe and get me to work without any problems.' This is a miracle.'

Bobby Crutsinger says his organization needs more donations, cars, trucks, RVs, campers, and volunteers to keep doing their good work around the state. While many benefactors of the non-profit are in Parker County and surrounding areas, Crutsinger has gone as far as South Padre Island to deliver RVs.

"I'm not rich, I'm blessed," Crutsinger said. "It's not about the money, it's about helping people. I believe in helping people out."

Along with providing donated vehicles, the organization also raises money to help others through its resale shop. Caitlyn, the Crutsingers' daughter, was in tow during the delivery of the Civic to Herrin and the Crutsingers' sons can often be found working behind the counter or in the storage area of their shop.

"Everything we do involves our children," Peggy Crutsinger said. Caitvln hopes for the non-profit to be her family legacy and plans on passing it down when she has kids one day.

"They're awesome people," Pyle said of the Crutsingers. "They work their tails off and I believe (Herrin is) truly deserving of it."

Later this month, the Crutsingers hope to continue blessing others with their yearly Christmas giveaways but with a new twist. **Operation Texas Strong will** be the starting location for the First Annual Toy Run

on Oct. 21. Vehicles of all kinds are invited to join a caravan traveling from the Crutsinger's resale store at 1507 Ranger Highway, Suite 103 in Weatherford to Boondocks PK Bar & Grill on Possum Kingdom Lake. Drivers can either bring a gift or a \$10 donation to drop off at their choice of boxes at the resale store. Palo Pinto Volunteer Fire Department or at Boondocks.

The event is in collaboration with Austin's Sunshine Foundation and the Lonestar Syndicate Social Club. Lineup will begin at the Crutsingers' shop at 10 a.m. Oct. 21. Toys collected by

Operation Texas Strong will be given to families in Parker County throughout November and December. Crutsinger is asking for unopened new toys and clothes for children.

"When I was a kid, I didn't have toys under the tree," Bobby Crutsinger said. "So I know how it feels when you wake up in the morning and say, 'hey, I got toys.' It's not just about the toy, it's about families being able to help each other, to work things out, give people spirit and to know what Christmas is all about."

Through their experience, the Crutsingers have learned many families are self-con-

scious about receiving charity, so they have designed a process where families can schedule a time and date to come to the resale shop for their children to pick out the items they'd like in a private setting. Last year, they were able to serve 486 families around Christmas time, Crutsinger said.

"We just want to make sure all the kids have toys in Parker County," Bobby Crutsinger said. "I just want to see a big turnout. This is in support of the Parker County kids, all the communities working together to show kids they're loved and wanted.'



Azle native named Tarrant County Administrator after historic retirement of G.K. Maenius

Merritt outlines his thoughts and hopes going forward as Tarrant's second-ever county administrator

Fort Worth — On Sept. 30, an era in Tarrant County history came to an end. G.K. Maenius, the longest-serving county administrator in Texas and Tarrant County's first administrator, retired. Since 1988, Maenius has shaped the county through his foundational 35-year tenure, overseeing a doubling of the county's population. The commissioners court plans to rename the Tarrant County Administration Building after Maenius.

Chandler Merritt, an Azle native and former assistant county administrator, took the reins Oct. 1.

"I'm proud to say I was raised right here in Azle." Merritt said. "I went from kindergarten all the way through to the graduating class of 2000 at Azle High School. In fact, every morning I drop my two oldest kids off at Eagle Heights, the same elementary school I attended all those years ago. My father served on the Azle City Council. When I was younger, I attended some of those meetings, quickly learning just how im-

portant and meaningful the work was that he performed in public service. This created a sense of public service in me, a passion I hold to this very day as the new Tarrant County Administrator. In high school I was a proud member of the Marching Green Pride as a member of the drumline and served as loading crew chief. From trick-or-treating to swimming lessons, I did it all in Azle.'

Merritt's long history of administration and service in both the public and private sectors and his familiarity with the county make him one of the most qualified successors of Maenius' legacy.

"I was in the role of assistant county administrator for over two years and before that chief of staff to the county judge for four," Merritt said. "During my time in the county judge's office, I was quickly schooled in the ways of county government and how it is similar (but definitely not the same) as city government. Interacting with the many county departments as well as the 69 independently elected officials, I learned just what services the county provided

as an administrative arm to the State of Texas. From vital records to public health and safety, to the criminal justice system, Tarrant County serves as the core functional piece of local government to supports its citizens. As an assistant county administrator, my portfolio included core functional departments of the county such as emergency management, fire marshal's office, facilities, information technology, and the medical examiner's office. However, being in the administrator's office and with the design of county government, there is always additional cross-functional work which provided me exposure to all county departments under and outside of the commissioners court."

Having served directly under Maenius, Merritt has overseen approximately 400 employees and a \$300 million budget.

"Following in the footsteps of the longest-serving county administrator in Texas will never be a walk in the park, especially when I walk in every day and see his name on the administration building,' Merritt said. "But I'm hon-

ored to call him a friend and a mentor who has really helped me develop my leadership style. Mr. Maenius is nothing short of a legend who was able to successfully lead the county for the past 35 years when the population was over one million less in population than it is today. That being said, when he tells me 'you are going to do just fine,' it brings about a confidence and a sense of purpose in my professional life, which I am ready and eager to fulfill."

Merritt hopes to carry on the legacy of success Tarrant County has experienced in past decades and continue to serve his community to his full ability.

"My goals are simple, fulfill the mission and vision of the commissioners court," Merritt said. "Be their administrator and implement their policies. As far as my mindset goes, I am a firm believer in the idea of servant leadership. I see my job as making everyone else's job more efficient and effective. I absolutely love the county I grew up in, so much that I not only want to be a major piece of its leadership team but more importantly my wife Nikki and

41-year-old Chandler Merritt has recently taken over the role of Tarrant County Administrator. Both Merritt's mother and aunt have worked for Tarrant County, his father is a former Azle city council member, and his sister currently works as a nurse at Tarrant County's John Peter Smith Hospital. "I'm happy to say how much my family has been and is involved in Tarrant County," Merritt said. "Go Hornets!"

I have decided this is where we want to raise our family so our kids can grow up having



Superliminal

It's all a matter of perspective



GAME ON By Jennifer Harrison

My opinions on computer gaming and some of my favorite games. I've been playing games on the home computer since the days of the Trash 80. I love indie, open-world, unique, puzzle, and resource games. The . cake is a lie

In the game Superliminal, by Pillow Castle Games, you're helping Dr. Glenn Pierce test the SomnaSculpt technology by going through a dream therapy program.

You wake up in a generic hotel room with a classic digital clock. At first things are pretty normal. You'll find you can pick up objects across the room that appear small in perspective, but when you pick up an object and bring it closer to you, it grows to a ridiculous size. Or you can pick up an item close to you and cause it to shrink by placing it further away.

The premise of the game is that you're in a dream therapy session, and this is part of the therapy — a series of puzzles that can be completed by using optical illusions and forced perspective. Dr. Pierce communicates with you via radios in various locations, communicating your progress and creating a narrative for the story.

Some of the puzzles can be

and making them larger, so that you can get on top of them. Some puzzles must be solved by finding the right perspective in a two-dimensional image. Once the image is complete, the object can be picked up to solve the next puzzle.

solved by picking up objects

Things start to get weird when the player fails to wake up, and ends up in the dreamworld, back inside the generic hotel room with the digital clock again. Dr. Pierce tells you through the radio that they have lost track of where you are in the simulation.

Eventually the AI that is running the dream therapy session tells you that you must initiate an "Explosive Mental Overload" to trigger the "Emergency Exit Protocol" and escape the dreamworld. However, the attempt fails and the player is trapped in the dreamworld. Eventually you'll complete the puzzles and escape, returning to the room you started in and wak-

ing up.

All in all, it's definitely a surreal experience, and will make you feel as if there's something really creepy about these liminal spaces you're in. A liminal space is an area you usually see with people, which for some reason is empty. It's very much like being in an area of a hotel convention center where you took the wrong turn while looking for the bathroom. No matter how many hallways you walk down, you can never find the door that leads to the outside. Fortunately,

there's no Backrooms monster to scare you in this game; December 2021. it's just a series of visual puzzles.

Superliminal was developed by Albert Shih and his team with Pillow Castle Games, many of whom were recruited from the Entertainment Technology Center at Carnegie Mellon University. When those students graduated, he had to hire more people to finish the job. It was released on Steam on Nov. 5, 2020. Five additional 'Group Therapy' maps and a cooperative mode were

available as a free update in

Shih's goal was to make a first-person game that was just 'moving cubes around.' He was inspired by the tourist photos of people pretending to hold up the Tower of Pisa. Shih wanted an open world concept with several solutions to the puzzles, so players could think creatively about solving problems. "Superliminal is a first-person puzzle game based on forced perspective and optical illusions. Puzzles in this game give you a sense of the

unexpected. Players need to change their perspective and think outside the box to wake up from the dream."

Superliminal has been generally enjoyed by players with its unique gameplay, the only complaint being that the game is too short. It was a finalist for "Most Innovative Gameplay" on Steam in 2020. Available on SteamOS for Mac and PC for \$19.99.



ORDER CALLING A BOND ELECTION AND NOTICE OF BOND ELECTION

THE STATE OF TEXAS PARKER, TARRANT AND WISE COUNTIES AZLE INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Azle Independent School District (the "*District*") hereby orders a special bond election (the "*Election*") to be held on November 7, 2023 and submits to qualified voters the propositions described herein; and

WHEREAS, the bond referendum is subject to the provisions of Section 45.003, Texas Education Code, and the District is contracting with Tarrant County, Texas (*"Tarrant County"*); Parker County, Texas (*"Parker County"*) and Wise County, Texas (*"Wise County"*, and together with Tarrant County and Parker County, the *"Counties"*) for the administration of the Election pursuant to an interlocal agreement with the Counties (the *"Election Contract"*); and

WHEREAS, Tarrant County, acting through the Tarrant County Elections Administrator (the "Tarrant County Elections Administrator") in accordance with the Election Contract will provide for the administration of the Election for residents of the District residing in Tarrant County; Parker County, acting through the Parker County Elections Administrator (the "Parker County Elections Administrator") in accordance with the Election Contract will provide for the administration of the Elections for residents of the District residing in Parker County Elections Administrator") in accordance with the Election Contract will provide for the administration of the Elections for residents of the District residing in Parker County; and Wise County, acting through the Wise County Elections Administrator (the "Wise County Elections Administrator" and together with the Tarrant County Elections Administrator and Parker County Elections Administrator, the "Elections Administrators") in accordance with the Election Contract will provide for the administration of the Election for residents of the District residing in Parker County Elections Administrator and Parker County Elections Administrator, the "Elections Administrators") in accordance with the Election Contract will provide for the administration of the Election for residents of the District residing in Wise County; and

WHEREAS, it is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this Order was adopted was open to the public, and public notice of the time, place, and purpose of the meeting was given, all as required by the Texas Government Code, Chapter 551.

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE AZLE INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT:

Section 1. Findings. The statements contained in the preamble of this Order are true and correct and adopted as findings of fact and operative provisions hereof.

Section 2. Election Ordered; Polling Places. The Election shall be held in the District between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. on November 7, 2023 (*"Election Day"*). The Election is to be conducted by the Counties, as provided by Chapter 271, Texas Election Code (the *"Code"*) and the Election Contract. Voting for Election Day and Early Voting shall occur on the dates and during the hours and at the designated polling places as set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto, which exhibit is hereby made a part hereof for all intents and purposes. Exhibit A shall be modified to include additional or different Election Day polling places required to conform to the Code and the Election Contract.

Section 3. Early Voting. Early voting shall be administered by the Counties. Early voting by personal appearance shall begin on October 23, 2023, and conclude on November 3, 2023 and will be conducted at the Early Voting locations on the dates and at the times specified in <u>Exhibit A</u> attached hereto. The early voting polling places shall remain open during such hours for early voting by personal appearance for any registered voter of the District at such voting place. <u>Exhibit A</u> shall be modified to include additional or different early voting polling places required to conform to the Election Contract and the Code.

Section 4. Election Officials. The appointment of the Presiding Election Judges, Alternate Judges, Early Voting Clerks, the Presiding Judge of the early ballot board and other election officials for the Election shall be made by the Elections Administrators in accordance with the Election Contract and the Code. The Elections Administrators may employ other personnel necessary for the proper administration of the Election, including such part-time help as is necessary to prepare for the Election, to ensure the timely delivery of supplies during early voting and on Election Day, and for the efficient tabulation of ballots at the central counting station. The Board of Trustees hereby authorizes the Superintendent, President, Vice President or the Secretary of the Board of Trustees to execute or attest on behalf of the District the Election Contract with the Counties.

Section 5. Voting by Mail. Applications for voting by mail for all residents of the District shall submitted by personal delivery or shall be mailed to the address below prior to the deadline prescribed by law:

Section 6. Early Voting Ballots. An Early Voting Ballot Board shall be created to process early voting results of the Election and the Presiding Judge of the Early Voting Ballot Board shall be designated by the Elections Administrators. The Presiding Judge of the Early Voting Ballot Board shall appoint two or more additional members to constitute the Early Voting Ballot Board members and, if needed, the Signature Verification Committee members required to efficiently process the early voting ballots.

Section 7. Qualified Voters. All qualified electors of and residing in the District, shall be entitled to vote at the election.

Section 8. Propositions. At the Election the following PROPOSITIONS shall be submitted in accordance with law:

Shall the Board of Trustees of the Azle Independent School District be authorized to issue bonds of the District, in one or more series, in the aggregate principal amount of \$151,500,000 for the purpose of constructing, renovating, improving and equipping school facilities consisting of: renovations at each existing elementary campus to create Pre-K through 5th grade campuses, replacement campus for Azle Junior High for 6th through 8th grades to be located at the current Azle Junior High site, expansion of Forte Junior High for 6th through 8th grades, and a maintenance warehouse/AISD police department facility upgrade to be constructed on land already owned by the District, with any surplus proceeds remaining after completion of such projects to be used for the construction, acquisition, renovation and equipping of other school facilities in the District, with the bonds to mature, bear interest, and be issued and sold in accordance with law at the time of issuance; and shall the Board of Trustees be authorized to levy and pledge, and cause to be assessed and collected, annual ad valorem taxes, on all taxable property in the District, sufficient, without limit as to rate or amount, to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds?

Section 9. Ballots. The official ballots for the Election shall be prepared in accordance with the Texas Election Code to permit the electors to vote "FOR" or "AGAINST" the aforesaid PROPOSITIONS with the ballots to contain such provisions, markings and language as required by law, and with such PROPOSITIONS to be expressed substantially as follows:

Section 10. Compliance with Federal Law. In all respects, the Election shall be conducted in accordance with the Code. Pursuant to the federal Help America Vote Act ("*HAVA*") and the Code, at each polling place there shall be at least one voting system that is equipped for disabled individuals, and each such voting system shall be a system that has been certified by the Texas Secretary of State as compliant with HAVA and the Code. The voting system to be used by the Elections Administrators in administering the Election is such a system, and orders that such voting equipment or other equipment certified by the Texas Secretary of State shall be used by the District in its elections.

Section 11. Debt Obligations. The following information is provided in accordance with the provisions of Section 3.009(b), Texas Election Code.

- (a) The proposition language that will appear on the ballot is set forth in Section 9 hereof.
- (b) The purpose for which the bonds are to be authorized is set forth in Section 8 hereof.
- (c) The principal amount of the debt obligations to be authorized is \$151,500,000 for Proposition A.

(d) If the bonds are approved by the voters, the Board of Trustees will be authorized to levy annual ad valorem taxes, on all taxable property in the District, sufficient, without limit as to rate or amount, to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds.

(e) Based upon the bond market conditions at the date of adoption of this Order, the maximum interest rate for any series of the bonds is estimated to be 5.25%. Such estimate considers several factors, including the issuance schedule, maturity schedule and the expected bond ratings of the proposed bonds. Such estimated maximum interest rate is provided as a matter of information but is not a limitation on the interest rate at which the bonds or notes, or any series thereof, may be sold.

(f) If the bonds are approved, they may be issued in one or more series, to mature serially, over a period not to exceed thirty years from the date of issuance of each series of bonds.

(g) The aggregate amount of the outstanding principal of the District's debt obligations as of the date of this Order is \$131,490,000.00.

(h) The aggregate amount of the outstanding interest of the District's debt obligations as of the date of this Order is \$66,931,962.50.

(i) The ad valorem debt service tax rate for the District as of the date of this Order is \$0.2741 per \$100 of taxable assessed valuation.

During first period class, soccer coach Diego Oliveras guides these players through strength and conditioning workouts designed especially for them by strength coach Matthew Holt.

"His biggest emphasis coming into this year has been getting our conditioning up," Oliveras said. "It's a lot of designed time runs, where the idea is not that they give 100% effort one time, but they give 70-80% effort repeated times. That builds what we like to call their gas tanks, so come season, come games, they are able to perform longer."

At 7:15 a.m. on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays, the soccer boys hit the track or the gym, running or lift-

ing weights. On Tuesday and Thursdays, they meet a bit later — at 8 a.m. — and discuss soccer knowledge.

"As we get closer to the season, we will start to shift the other way, where soccer will become the emphasis, with the idea that they are already in shape and ready to go for the season," he said.

Between August and November, high school football is the big-dog daddy sport, with crowds cramming into the outdoor stadiums for Friday night fun.

When January rolls around, the soccer team controls the field. They play games in colder weather than football and with smaller crowds, but the soccer boys are no less dedicated. They'll be conditioning themselves for weeks to come.

After-school practices begin on Nov. 27, and the team's first scrimmage is set for Dec. 8.

This year's Hornets include seven or eight players who were on varsity last year, and they will be expected to excel on the field while mentoring younger players for the future.

"Every year is trying to find that perfect blend of experienced boys trying to help the younger boys along so that when they're gone, the cycle continues, and they leave the next class as prepared as they were," Oliveras said. She wants to make playoffs this year and make it to state before she graduates.


"It's probably a really big goal to set right now because we have a very young team, but that is one of my big goals for senior year," Skartvedt said.



Tennis gives her a sense of relief, a feeling of responsibility, and self confidence.


"I've been a lot happier," she said. "It's nice to have a hobby that I play consistently. It's something I look forward to every day. It's one of the most exciting parts of the day for me."

ORDER CALLING A BOND ELECTION AND NOTICE OF BOND ELECTION

THE STATE OF TEXAS PARKER AND WISE COUNTIES SPRINGTOWN INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Springtown Independent School District (the "District") deems it advisable to call the bond election hereinafter ordered (the "Election"); and

WHEREAS, the bond referendum is subject to the provisions of Section 45.003, Texas Education Code, and the District is contracting with Wise County, Texas ("*Wise County*") and Parker County, Texas ("*Parker County*", and together with Wise County, the "*Contracting Counties*") for the administration of the Election pursuant to an interlocal agreement with the Contracting Counties (the "*Election Contract*"); and

WHEREAS, Wise County, acting through the Wise County Elections Administrator (the "Wise County Elections Administrator") in accordance with the Election Contract will provide for the administration of the Election for residents of the District residing in Wise County, and Parker County, acting through the Parker County Elections Administrator (the "Parker County Elections Administrator", together with the Wise County Elections Administrator, the "Elections Administrators") in accordance with the Election Contract will provide for the administration of the Election for residents of the District residing in Parker County, Texas; and

WHEREAS, it is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this Order was adopted was open to the public, and public notice of the time, place, and purpose of the meeting was given, all as required by the Texas Government Code, Chapter 551.

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE SPRINGTOWN INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT:

<u>Section 1</u>. The statements contained in the preamble of this Order are true and correct and adopted as findings of fact and operative provisions hereof.

<u>Section 2</u>. *Election Ordered; Polling Places*. The Election shall be held in the District between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. on November 7, 2023 ("*Election Day*"). The Election is to be conducted and administered by the Contracting Counties as provided by Chapter 271 and Chapter 31, Subchapter D of the Texas Election Code (the "*Code*"), and the Election Contract. Election Day and Early Voting shall occur on the dates and during the hours and at the designated polling places as set forth in <u>Exhibit "A"</u> attached hereto, which exhibit is hereby made a part hereof for all intents and purposes. <u>Exhibit "A</u>" shall be modified to include additional or different Election Day polling places required to conform to the Election Contract and the Code.

<u>Section 3</u>. *Early Voting*. Early voting shall be administered by the Contracting Counties. Early Voting by personal appearance shall begin on October 23, 2023, and conclude on November 3 and will be conducted at the Early Voting locations on the dates and at the times specified in <u>Exhibit "A"</u> attached hereto. The early voting polling places shall remain open during such hours for early voting by personal appearance for any registered voter of the District at such voting place. <u>Exhibit "A"</u> shall be modified to include additional or different early voting polling places required to conform to the Election Contract and the Code.

<u>Section 6</u>. *Early Voting Ballots*. An Early Voting Ballot Board shall be created to process early voting results of the Election, and the Presiding Judge of the Early Voting Ballot Board shall be designated by the Elections Administrators. The Presiding Judge of the Early Voting Ballot Board shall appoint two or more additional members to constitute the Early Voting Ballot Board members and, if needed, the Signature Verification Committee members required to efficiently process the early voting ballots.

<u>Section 7</u>. *Qualified Voters*. All qualified electors of and residing in the District, shall be entitled to vote at the election.


Section 8. *Proposition*. At the Election the following PROPOSITION shall be submitted in accordance with law:

SPRINGTOWN INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT SPECIAL ELECTION SPRINGTOWN INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT PROPOSITION A

Shall the Board of Trustees of the Springtown Independent School District be authorized to issue the bonds of the District, in one or more series, in the aggregate principal amount of \$120,780,000 for the purpose of constructing, improving, and equipping a new middle school campus; restroom renovations at the existing intermediate school and purchasing land for school buildings; with the bonds to mature, bear interest, and be issued and sold in accordance with law at the time of issuance; and shall the Board of Trustees be authorized to levy and pledge, and cause to be assessed and collected, annual ad valorem taxes, on all taxable property in the District, sufficient, without limit as to rate or amount, to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds?

<u>Section 9</u>. *Ballots*. The official ballots for the Election shall be prepared in accordance with the Texas Election Code to permit the electors to vote "FOR" or "AGAINST" the aforesaid PROPOSITION with the ballots to contain such provisions, markings and language as required by law, and with such PROPOSITION to be expressed substantially as follows:

<u>Section 10</u>. Compliance with Federal Law. In all respects, the Election shall be conducted in accordance with the Code. Pursuant to the federal Help America Vote Act ("HAVA") and the Code, at each polling place there shall be at least one voting system that is equipped for disabled individuals, and each such voting system shall be a system that has been certified by the Texas Secretary of State as compliant with HAVA and the Code. The District hereby finds that the voting system to be used by the Contracting Counties in administering the Election is such a system, and orders that such voting equipment or other equipment certified by the Texas Secretary of State shall be used by the District in its elections.

<u>Section 4.</u> *Election Officials.* The appointment of the Presiding Election Judges, Alternate Judges, Early Voting Clerks, the Presiding Judge of the early ballot board and other election officials for the Election shall be made by the Elections Administrators.

<u>Section 5.</u> *Voting by Mail.* Applications for voting by mail for all residents of the District shall submitted by personal delivery or shall be mailed to the address below prior to the deadline prescribed by law:

<u>Section 11.</u> The Board of Trustees hereby authorizes the Superintendent, President, Vice President or the Secretary of the Board of Trustees to execute or attest on behalf of the District the Election Contract with the Contracting Counties.

<u>Section 12</u>. The following information is provided in accordance with the provisions of Section 3.009(b), Texas Election Code.

(a) The proposition language that will appear on the ballot is set forth in Section 9 hereof.

(b) The purpose for which the bonds are to be authorized is set forth in Section 8 hereof.

(c) The principal amount of the debt obligations to be authorized is \$120,780,000 for Proposition A.

(d) If the bonds are approved by the voters, the Board of Trustees will be authorized to levy annual ad valorem taxes, on all taxable property in the District, sufficient, without limit as to rate or amount, to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds and the cost of any credit agreements executed in connection with the bonds.

(e) Based upon the bond market conditions at the date of adoption of this Order, the maximum interest rate for any series of the bonds is estimated to be 4.750%. Such estimate considers several factors, including the issuance schedule, maturity schedule and the expected bond ratings of the proposed bonds. Such estimated maximum interest rate is provided as a matter of information but is not a limitation on the interest rate at which the bonds or notes, or any series thereof, may be sold.

(f) If the bonds are approved, they may be issued in one or more series, to mature serially, over a period not to exceed forty years from the date of issuance of each series of bonds, although the District estimates the bonds will be issued over a period not to exceed thirty years (although thirty years is not a legal limitation on the future issuance of the bonds and is dependent on taxable valuations and market conditions at the time of issuance of the bonds).

(g) The aggregate amount of the outstanding principal of the District's debt obligations as of the date of this Order is \$43,605,000.

(h) The aggregate amount of the outstanding interest of the District's debt obligations as of the date of this Order is \$15,674,088.

(i) The ad valorem debt service tax rate for the District as of the date of this Order is \$0.2003 per \$100 of taxable assessed valuation.




