Poolville nonprofit rescues Azle fawn

Carrie Long of Texas Fawn and Friends talks tips on handling baby deer, shares experiences

PARKER COUNTY — A week-old white-tail fawn found itself in the wrong place at the wrong time when a misplaced survival mechanism caused it to lay flat in the middle of Azle's Southeast Parkway. Just before the Loop 344 bridge, known locally as the "ski jump," that connects westbound Southeast Parkway to Main Street, a man driving a Spectrum internet truck stopped to motion drivers away from the animal and watched in horror as multiple vehicles passed right over, barely missing Bambi.

poor dear was a beat-up 2005 Honda Civic with a long history of transmission problems driven by Azle reporter, Zach Freeman. He noticed the concern on the man's face before he saw the deer, but by pure luck it passed between both sets of tires unscathed. After a call to animal control and attempts to leave the fawn in the woods about 1,000 feet away proved unsuccessful (the fawn kept following Freeman back up to the road) the pair decided the best course of action was to take the fawn to the nearby Tri-County Reporter news office and figure out a plan from there. At the office, sales

The last car to pass over the rep Lora Paschal promptly named the fawn Frog, and the reporter soon found a haven for the animal just a 35-minute drive away.

Carrie Long is the founder and operator of Texas Fawn and Friends in Poolville. When Long received Frog, she already had another 35 fawns in her care, two of which had been brought to her in the last 12 hours. Long said she typically receives two to four new fawns per day in late May and early June, her busiest season and the time when most fawns are born. The fawns currently residing at the nonprofit, which doubles

Student presents Braille map of city hall to council members

AZLE — Hoover Elementary students are leaving their mark on the City of Azle. After showcasing their idea to create a Braille map for Azle City Hall at a "Shark Tank" style Gifted and Talented Program competition dubbed the Hornet Nest, Azle students took the idea to the city council itself. While two of the group's students, Lyam Havens and Alexis Senn were not present, sixth grader Samantha Bevan and GT teacher Rebecca Windham presented the idea to council members during a June 4 meeting for consideration.

Inspired by her own father's color-blindness, Bevan and her team met with industry professionals and studied real world implementations of similar ideas to develop their plan. In preparing, the team met with representatives of Lighthouse for the Blind of Fort Worth and toured its facility. The group also went to the University of North Texas to view the campus' own Braille map. At the council meeting, Beven described the group's process, its limitations and what it had accomplished so far.

"When they were thinking about what they wanted to do, her mindset was always something for Azle," Windham said at the meeting. "She never veered off from that. She just thought, 'what can I do for my city?' I was just so impressed with her, and she just continuously floors me. It was such a cool

opportunity for her to partner with Lighthouse for the Blind and UNT. It was such a big learning opportunity for them."

Using Lighthouse for the Blind's Braille printer, the students hope to create and deliver copies of the map to City Hall to use as a resource for any blind visitors to the building. Excited about the idea, Azle Mayor Alan Brundrett discussed the possibility of adding Braille room numbers in the building as well. Mayor Pro Tem Randa Goode, who also served as a Hornet's Nest judge, said she enjoyed seeing kids solve real problems and use their imaginations.

"This is very cool that a student in the school district was thinking of what we need here in the city," Goode said.

Springtown recognizes PTSD Awareness Month

At the May 30 Springtown City Council meeting, Mayor Greg Hood presents Deputy Police Chief Jamie Oliver with a proclamation in honor of Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder Awareness Month in June. According to the National Institute of Mental Health's website, PTSD occurs when a person continues to feel stressed or scared months after a traumatic event — like witnessing the violence of war, experiencing assault or abuse, or being involved in a car accident or disaster — when they are no longer in danger. People diagnosed with PTSD may have nightmares, flashbacks, negative thoughts and/or emotions as well as avoid things or places that remind them of the traumatic event, among other symptoms. "All citizens suffering from PTSD deserve our consideration, and those who are affected by PTSD from the wounds received while protecting our freedom deserve our respect and special honor," Hood said in his proclamation. He encouraged everyone to help bring awareness of PTSD, support to those who experience it and remove the disorder's stigma.

Shame can teach us boundaries. Without shame we would have no way to understand how our behavior affects others and how to manage it. At its very core, shame is about wanting to belong to a group and to be accepted as a good person inside the community.

As small children in school, we were all taught the norm was to not pick your nose. It is how our teachers and parents instructed us to act. But a part of the reason why we participated in the norm was the shame to be experienced if your fellow classmates learned you had broken the rule; to be judged, set apart for our actions, and to be excluded from the group. Those are all part of the reasons why we did not pick our nose.

Unfortunately, in our contemporary society, the concept of shame seems to have been thrown out the window. The usual standards of conduct, the social norms which have guided our existence for generations have seemingly been discarded. Growing up, I was blessed to have an incredible dad. He was not perfect by any stretch of the imagination, but he provided all the things a boy should have. He was a provider. There was not a day we went without, and he worked hard to provide for the four people directly under his care. He was a protector. I never felt concerned he would not be able to handle any threat of attack against us. He was resourceful. Even if our car broke down on the side of the highway, all he needed was a wrench and a screwdriver to get us back on track. He was a great counselor. He knew when to speak girls chose to take on my last truth in my life and when to let me work it out. I was so grateful to have such an incredible model of a dad growing up that it wasn't until I became a father when I realized I wanted to be a dad. You see, anyone can be a father, that is simply DNA reproducing. Being a dad is a choice of the heart.

A little over 19 years ago, my son made me a dad; it remains one of the most surreal days of my life. Seeing life enter the world will humble you in ways you never expected. Reno man dead after crash on SH 199 near Springtown

SPRINGTOWN — A two-ve- on the evening of June 4 hicle crash on state Highway about five miles west of 199 last week resulted in the death of a Reno man in his mid-50s.

The wreck took place Springtown. According to a press release from the Texas Department of Public Safety,

Brian McKay lost control of his Ford Windstar while driving west on SH 199 and skidded sideways. McKay's vehicle traveled into the eastbound lane and encoun-

tered a GMC Yukon, driven by Raymond Kohlman of Paradise. Kohlman tried to avoid crashing but instead hit McKay's vehicle. DPS will continue to investigate the

Tarrant County Medical Examiner ruled McKay's death an accident due to blunt force injuries. Kohlman survived the crash with

non-life-threatening injuries and was taken to Harris Methodist Hospital in Fort Worth.

Suspect apprehended after shooting on Richard Lane

AZLE — An Azle man was hospitalized with a potentially life-threatening gunshot wound and another was in police custody Tuesday afternoon following a domestic incident that turned violent.

At approximately 12:01 p.m. June 11, the Azle Fire and Police Departments responded to a 911 call from the victim of a shooting in the 100 block of Richard Lane. According to a press release from the Azle Police Department, one family

member shot another with a small caliber firearm after a verbal argument at the family's residence. Other family members were present including a small child, but no other injuries were reported. A preliminary police investigation determined the case to be an isolated incident and no threat to the public. The suspected perpetrator was taken into custody without a struggle after the APD arrived to find both parties outside the family home. As of Tuesday afternoon, the site is still considered to be a crime scene.

Due to severe weather conditions at the time, both CareFlite and Air Evac medivac teams were unable to retrieve the victim because of thunderstorms in the area, and he was instead taken by ground ambulance to Texas Health Harris Methodist Hospital in Fort Worth in stable condition but with potentially life-threatening injuries. According to APD Chief Ben Hall, the victim's injuries were declared not-life-threatening soon after, and he is expected to be released from medical care.

Parker County Precinct 3 gets more funding for rainwater harvesting system

BROCK — Parker County Precinct 3 recently completed construction on a new rainwater harvesting system at its headquarters. The organization, headed by commissioner Larry Walden, serves Parker County by overseeing construction and maintenance of roads within the district. A source of pride, during the May 30 ribbon cutting Walden described how the precinct's own employees had been the ones to do all the maintenance and construction for the project, according to the Weatherford Democrat.

Precinct 3 was one of several Upper Trinity Groundwater Conservation District rainwater harvesting program grant recipients last year. In April, the precinct was again selected as a grant finalist when UTGCD announced it will re-

ceive more funds for further expansion of the system.

UTGCD officials predict the site will be able to store close to or over 100,000 gallons of water when all systems are complete. As of the ribbon cutting, one 65,000-gallon tank has been completed and another 44,000-to-65,000gallon tank is in the works.

"With the combination of their grant funds and expected construction, the Precinct 3 site should be able to thrive solely on rainwater and will avoid using groundwater in the future," Jill Garcia, UTGCD assistant general manager said. "UTGCD anticipates this location, which is frequently utilized for community events, can act as a catalyst for surrounding landowners to consider rainwater harvesting on their homes and structures."

The project's impact has already begun to spread after Jacob Shaffer, a Natural **Resources Conservation** Service employee and district conservationist, recently took these concepts to the Alabama-Coushatta Tribe in Livingston, who now have their own rainwater harvesting system. This was one of the many demonstrations made in a partnership between NRCS and the Bureau of Indian Affairs Tribal Climate Resilience Southern Plains Region.

The district has four other projects that are moving forward with this year's rounds of grants including rainwater and irrigation systems at Slidell Independent School District, the City of Paradise, the City of New Fairview, and the Parker County Sheriff's Posse Rodeo Grounds.

as her home, range from just a few days to one month old. Long gets calls for deer in all situations with many of her charges having been struck by cars or found beside dead does on the side of the road. Sometimes, when a doe has twins or triplets, it may also abandon the babies it can't care for, Long said. It is not uncommon for others to be "fawn napped."

"Every one of them has a story," Long said. "Sometimes they get stolen, they shouldn't have been taken. Most people don't understand what the doe is trying to do, and they hide them for their safety."

When a doe encounters a predator, they will often flee and attempt to draw the predator away from their baby in a chase. In these instances, Long said the best thing to do is not approach the fawn and to instead leave and wait for the deer to come back and retrieve her offspring.

A Springtown High School graduate, Long has lived in Parker County all her life but for the last five years is one of the only people in the area licensed to rehabilitate fawns through Texas Parks and Wildlife. Long said fawns present many unique difficulties for wildlife rehabbers compared to smaller animals, so there are often fewer folks that can commit to the challenge.

"Fawns, there's a lot of detail to them, there's a lot of expense," Long said. "They're a bigger animal, so it takes a lot more ... There's not anybody in Parker County that does as many as I do. I do quite a lot."

Long has owned and raised horses all her life and is an avid animal lover, also rescuing tropical birds, doves and occasionally rehabbing other wildlife. Long went viral online in 2022, when a rehabbed raccoon named Jasper became good friends with a fawn named Hope.

She is active on Instagram and Facebook and as a 501(c) (3) nonprofit organization, Texas Fawn and Friends is made possible through public donations. Long also has an Amazon wish list set up for regularly needed supplies. To help pay the bills, Carrie Long and her husband, Wayland, also own a truck conversion business. The end goal of the program is to get the deer healthy enough that they can be released back into the

At 58, Long recently became a grandmother, and shows no signs of slowing down. Working for the most part by herself, caring for 36

"It's a lot of work but it's rewarding," Long said. "I love fawns, little Bambi, how could you not? They're very easy to imprint and they're very easy to love on for sure. So, all these guys will stay with me until December or January and then I release them. Some will survive, Mother Nature. We give them the opportunity to survive. I have the ability and maybe the knowledge. I get to meet some very awesome people,

Fawns have sensitive stomachs and feeding them anything other than deer's milk can result in death. For the first 10 weeks of their life, they require milk every doesn't eat can go downhill fast and a fawn that drinks anything other than deer's milk is unlikely to last long. After reaching out to a qualified rehabber, the next two to try and keep the deer in a warm, quiet space and never to feed it.

may need the assistance of a rehabber. When a fawn is injured, bleeding, has flies on it, has visible broken bones, discharge coming from the nose, or is crying out, it needs immediate help. When encountering a baby deer that exhibits any of these signs, Long said the best thing, and the first thing, a person should do is to contact a certified rehabber like herself. Getting the fawn the professional care it needs as quickly as possible is the best way to ensure its survival and

to be aware of their surroundings," Long said. "They didn't move into our environment, we moved into theirs. When in doubt, make a phone call. Everybody's got a cell phone, use it. Instead of hitting a fawn and keeping it in the house three or four days and then

'oh, it's not eating."

One of the most common questions Long said she gets asked is about the risk of catching diseases when handling wild deer. While deer don't pose a direct danger in transferring diseases to humans, they do carry ticks and other parasites that can. Also, while fawns look small and cute, Long said many don't expect the damage they can deal with their kicks and

"Their little feet will slice you in half," Long said. "By the end of the season my wardrobe changes because, as they get older, I'll get some

that'll just slice me in half." While city councils in Azle and other suburban Texas communities debate solutions to deer overpopulation, Long said she has lately not only seen more displaced fawns but more health problems as well. The cause, she

assumed, is inbreeding in the quickly growing suburbs of Willow Park and Hudson Oaks. According to Long, a big part of the problem lies in human encroachment.

"You find fawns that are not healthy. They're blind, they're deaf, they're lighter colored," Long said. "One of the newest fawns I got before this morning, a lady around the corner was very upset because it was in her yard. Her house has been there less than a year. I said, 'you realize that was a pasture before it was your house?' Mamas always have their babies in the same spot, just as we as women always go to the same doctor ... I didn't have any idea when I started this that I'd get the volume that I'd get, but for the most part at least it's several hours a day that's what I do."

Immediately after receiving the rescued fawn named

Frog, Long determined he was dehydrated through a small bend at the tip of his ear. She then used an intravenous drip to rehydrate the fawn. His head was then marked with a pink splotch of paint to differentiate him from the other deer in their shared baby crib. Long remarked that this year most of the fawns she's collected have been bucks, while last year, it was mostly does. Now in her care, Long said Frog has a good chance at surviving to adulthood. AZLE — During a June 4, Azle City Council meeting elected officials and city administrators held a public hearing on the Annual Drinking Water Report for 2023. Cities are required by the Environmental Protection Agency to release and discuss this report each year as part of the 1996 Safe Drinking

Water Act Amendments. On average, the City of Azle consumed 1.97 million gallons of water per day which equates to 719 million gallons drawn from Eagle Mountain Lake this year.

Iosh Henson, interim water plant superintendent, presented the report to the council. City Manager Tom Muir praised Henson for the quality of work thus far.

The water that comes from

faucets and taps within Azle city limits largely comes from the Azle Water Treatment Plant at 1500 Lakeview Drive. Water sampled for the report showed the city's water is at safe levels in at least 90% of the samples taken for copper and lead. Azle's respective copper and lead levels were 0.4700 parts per million and 3.400 parts per billion, well below the EPA's maximum contaminant levels of 1.3

parts per million and 15 parts deposits from forming. per billion. The report finds that water within the city of Azle does not violate any of the EPA's tested categories, and it also determines that Azle has hard water at 122 mg/L CaCO3 with a pH of 8.1. The slightly higher alkalinity of Azle water is intended to strike a balance with its hardness to both reduce wear on plumbing by preventing corrosivity and prevent mineral

The report notes that Azle residents may notice an "earthy taste" in the water during summer due to the production of geosmin by the lake's resident algae. While safe to drink, the report states that in the past geosmin levels have reached 400 parts per trillion during summers or 10 to 20 times the average for the rest of the year. Residents who are concerned

by any unusual tastes or colors in their water are advised to call 817-444-2441 to report the issue. For any other water related questions, residents may call the treatment plant at 817-752-2686.

SISD to comply with new law by helping teachers plan lessons

SPRINGTOWN — Planning lessons as a Springtown Independent School District teacher is expected to look

different next school year. Texas House Bill 1605, which was passed last year, states that school districts can't require teachers "for a foundation curriculum course to spend planning and preparation time to which the teacher is entitled under Section 21.404 creating or selecting instructional materials to initially cover the applicable essential knowledge and skills for the course unless the teacher has entered into a supplemental agreement described by Subsection (a).'

The new law goes on to state, "This subsection may not be construed to prohibit a classroom teacher from choosing to spend the teacher's planning and preparation time creating or selecting instructional materials."

SISD Assistant Superintendent of Academics Tiffany Cano reported during last month's school board meeting that the Texas Education Agency determined through survey results that teachers have been spending about seven hours a week developing instructional materials.

"(That) doesn't leave them very much time to have a family," Cano said. "We all heard that from our teachers for a while now, like there's just no time, no time, no time to

get anything done. Now we actually have the data to show that of course they don't have time to get everything done. They're spending a lot of time pulling their instructional materials together.'

In addition, studies conducted both in Texas and across the country showed low rigor in classrooms and that less than 20% of classes were using lessons that were on or above the grade level standards. Cano said.

Before the new law was passed, SISD shared responsibility with teachers; the district determined the scope and sequence of education as well as testing while teachers developed lesson plans, Cano said. Now, the district will help provide lesson plans using adopted instructional ma-

terials while teachers will be tasked with taking what the district gives them and adapting it to their classrooms.

"If I was a teacher, and I had a lesson that was given to me, I would look at it and say, 'OK, I'm going to teach this lesson, and I know I have four emergent bilinguals in my class. Now I'm going to focus on what do I need to build into this lesson so that my four emergent bilingual students can be successful?" Cano said. "I have three (gifted and talented) students in this class. What part of this can I enhance or what do I need to build in for them so that they can continue to grow and be successful? And same on, going with our special education students or just looking at the needs of

my kids in general." If teachers were to devel-

op their own lesson plans, Cano said the district may have to give them more compensation.

Texas Classroom Teachers Association advocated for some of the protections in HB 1605, according to its website. Cano said some SISD teachers were concerned about not being able to write their own lesson plans, but the district is working on addressing those worries. She believes the concerned teachers will eventually realize the benefits of the new system.

"They're going to see how it actually has taken some things off their plate yet made them better as teachers because they can focus on those specific needs of

the kids," Cano said. "There's no way you can be an expert on high quality instructional materials, your students, teaching ... you can't; there's no way to be able to do every single one of those perfectly every day, so we're trying to help with that part."

When asked by board members, Cano assured them teachers will not be forced to follow a script in their classrooms, and there will be room for flexibility. Teachers will also have access to instructional coaching.

"In no way is it scripted, or does it have to be word for word," Cano said. "There are scripts there for those who need it, but we have never asked our teachers to read word for word off a sheet of paper."

Azle band director to tour Europe with jazz band

Chapman is lead trombonist for Curt Wilson Alumni Band; public concert slated for AHS

AZLE — Azle Junior High School's own Kevin Chapman is excited to bring worldclass music to the city. The longtime Azle band director will be playing alongside the Curt Wilson Alumni Band during a free public performance at Azle High School June 19 at 6:30 p.m., the night before the band leaves for a European tour. The Curt Wilson Alumni Band consists of Texas Christian University alumni and former students of retired TCU Director of Jazz and Texas Jazz Educators Association Hall of Fame inductee Curt Wilson.

After Wilson's retirement in 2011, former students from throughout his 35-yearcareer joined together to play for their former teacher. Not long after, TCU's Director of Bands, Bobby Francis, proposed even bigger plans for the group. With the right

connections, Wilson's former students, including Chapman as lead trombone, were slated to perform at the Royal College of Music in London, the Old Spitalfields Market in East London and finally a special Fourth of July concert at The American Cemetery at Omaha Beach in Normandy, France. Members of the band came from all walks of life and all corners of the country, but were brought together by their gratitude for Wilson and their love of jazz.

"Curt Wilson was an integral part of my life," Chapman said. "He has a huge impact on me both musically as well as growing into the man I have become. I know this holds true for the many other students he had through the years. When he selected me to be his lead trombonist for the band it was the greatest honor of my life. He could have selected any of his lead trombonists going back to the year 1976. I still have the email from him today in a scrapbook, I will never throw it away!"

The band reconvened again in 2015 and 2019 for subsequent European tours. Now in 2024, Wilson is in his 80s as he and his students prepare for their latest tour with three public concerts to be held later this month in Loutraki, Greece. In the past, Wilson has served as the band's conductor. This year, Wilson will not go on tour with the band due to health concerns but will attend the special June 19 performance at AHS.

"This band consists of former students of Curt Wilson's from all walks of life, from teachers to dentists and doctors and even professional musicians," Chapman said. "To be able to perform with such a world class band is a great honor and even greater honor to being them to our wonderful community here in Azle!



Wildlife on the Move brings animals to Azle



Teacher, librarian, nonprofit founder speak on conservation education

AZLE — Animals bring people together. At least that was the case at the Azle Memorial Library Tuesday, June 4 during a special presentation by nonprofit Wildlife on the Move. The free event introduced kids and their parents to a menagerie of local and exotic animals and taught fun science facts through the rapid-fire stylings of host and founder Eric Brittingham.

Brittingham started the organization in 2005 and today still uses it as a vehicle for education and conservation. Since November, Brittingham has also been promoting Wild for the Word, where he

helps raise money for organizations like the Texas Conservation Alliance and the Association of Zoos and Aquariums' Save Animals Facing Extinction initiative.

Azle's library held a 10:30 a.m. and a noon show, each bringing in over 180 library guests for nearly 400 people total. One such guest was Azle ISD graduate and now Fort Worth ISD kindergarten teacher, Madison Mowery. Mowery took students from her own class at Waverly Park Elementary to experience the wildlife show in her hometown.

"As a teacher, I feel that these opportunities are invaluable," Mowery said. "Other communities and libraries do not offer such rich experiences during the summer, and it allows the students to explore things they otherwise would never see. I belong to Fort Worth ISD, but I did research about reading programs and opportunities for learning this summer in FWISD and Azle was where I was finding the most valuable opportunities. I am also thankful to have gone to school in Azle because I know where to look for the summer learning opportunities. I plan on coming to more of the events and bringing the kids along."

Mowery brought three 5-year-olds, a 6-year-old, two 3-year-olds and two 2-yearolds from Fort Worth to sit front and center at the show in Azle.

"They all were mesmerized by the different creatures they don't see in day-to-day settings," Mowery said. "After we left the presentation, they wanted to go to the park and the 6-year-old was pointing out that there were lizards that were cousins of the monitor we saw. They couldn't stop talking about the animals and how they've seen it on TV, but never in real life. I asked them if they wanted to go to another library event and they all said 'Yes!' It was very enjoyable to me as well. I'm always looking for meaningful learning experiences to enrich the classroom when we go back to school."

Among the different animals shown off by Brittingham were a native kingsnake, an opossum, a tenrec from Madagascar, a

savannah monitor lizard, and an Australian jungle carpet python.

In call and response, Brittingham listed off facts about the 7-foot-long python and had the audience repeat an introductory phrase.

"Everybody say 'stretchy, stretchy.' The guy can stretch to eat things two to three times the size of my head," Brittingham said. "Yes, he likes to eat mice and rats, but he also likes to eat birds and the only flying mammal. What's that everybody? Airline pilots!"

Living on a farm with parents who were teachers,
Brittingham grew up loving animals and science in equal measure. He attended
Stephen F. Austin University to become a teacher but missed hands-on animal education and went to work for the Dallas Zoo. While at the

zoo, Brittingham said he noticed that some schools did not have the funds to bring their students on field trips to learn about the animals, which inspired his decision to instead bring the field trip to them.

"It's huge because the kids we see at our shows are the next generation that are going to carry that torch," Brittingham said. "Without the animals, we're not going to survive. Everything is becoming electronic so they're losing touch with nature. If you can do a show like this where they can see the animals are important and they're valuable, and they're not scary, and are not going to hurt you, but you do need to have respect for them when they're in the wild, then they're going to make differences.'

Brittingham said his goal is to help get kids over their fears of animals through fun and education. For children's librarian Ava Bryant, this proved true.

"I have a fear of snakes myself and I touched a snake. I think the kids are much braver than me," Bryant said. "I just think it's a great opportunity for the kids to be able to interact with animals and the conservation part is important too. 

SPRINGTOWN -Springtown High School graduate Paige Winstead walked out of the ring at the Parker County Stock Show this year for the last time with the highest title she has ever won.

Winstead earned reserve champion in the show's market lamb competition as well as medium wool reserve champion. As icing on the cake, she also took home the award for Yorkshire reserve champion in the market swine contest.

This is a result Winstead had hoped for going into the competition and worked hard

"It's very rewarding," she said. "It's something that we've been waiting for, for a long time to happen. It finally did. It's just very exciting."

This year hasn't been easy for Winstead. As a senior, she had a lot on her mind and her schedule, but she learned to hold herself accountable for her animal projects and work with them in the barn even when she didn't want to.

"I had a bunch of stuff going on, so my mindset was just all over the place," Winstead said. "I had to get told that I really need to be in the barn with my animals if we want a successful year. So that's when I started changing my mindset and wanting to do better and work my sheep every day. Even if I really didn't want to, I needed

But Winstead wasn't alone in training and caring for her animals. She credited her father for lending a hand when she couldn't be in the barn herself.

"Most people don't have a dad like I do," she said. "It's very helpful to have someone that is always just there and willing to help you."

Winstead has been showing livestock at Parker County's show since she was 7 years old. At first, she worked with pigs but grew tired with how stubborn they could be, so

she moved on to the more co-

operative lambs.

"With the pig, you have a stick, and you just hit it, and no matter how hard you hit it, they're going to do what they want," Winstead said. "But with a lamb, you have your hands on them, and you really are in control of the animal, and you know what you

want the animal to do."
However, Winstead's winning lamb and pig turned out to be the exception to her general rule. She described

her reserve champion lamb, named Hourglass because of the way he looked from above, as stubborn and uncooperative while her winning Yorkshire was sweet and easy to work with.

Despite her troubles with Hourglass, the lamb didn't give Winstead a hard time in the ring on the day of the show. One of her friends initially showed Hourglass while Winstead was showing another animal, and he did not cooperate at all. Once he was back in Winstead's hands, Hourglass left his fussiness behind.

"He was calm. He did ev-

erything that I needed him to do," she said. "It's honestly the best I've ever worked with him. He was perfect."

Now that she has graduated, Winstead doesn't have any agricultural-related plans moving forward. She expects to attend cosmetology school at Weatherford College so she can work as a haircare professional. The one way she may return to raising livestock is if she someday has children who are interested in it.

The Parker County Stock Show was held after SHS' graduation, so Winstead could have opted not to show any animals, but she wanted


to finish her livestock career where she had started it. She described her final show as bittersweet and remembered the days when her family used to pack into a camper and spend the whole week at the show and rodeo.

"It was very overwhelming," Winstead said of her final show. "You definitely don't think of that as you're in the ring, but the second you walk out is when it's like, 'Wow,

that's the last time I'm going to go in there.' It really got me whenever I saw my dad, and he got real sad about it. But I'm just glad that I had the support system that I did to be able to get me through my last show there."

Winstead's mother, Cally Winstead, shared how proud she is of her daughter, not just for her performance at Parker County but her success throughout show season. Being involved with FFA and livestock raising has taught her kids to be humble and respectful, among other life lessons, and Cally Winstead was happy to have raised her children in that environment.

"You can't ask for a better community of people to be around," Cally Winstead said. "It was very good for them, I think, growing up in that."


