Last Day of Attendance Scheduled for Vestal Students



Vestal Central School District, assuming that there are no emergency closings between now and the end of the school year, has anticipated the last day of school for students in GradesK - 8 and 9 - 12.

In order to meet the minimum number-of-hours requirement and 180 days of instruction mandated by New York State, the District has scheduled the last day of pupil attendance for students in Grades K – 8 for Friday, June 23, 2023. Both Thursday, June 22, and Friday, June 23, will be half days for students in Grades K - 8.

At Vestal High School, the last day of pupil attendance for Grades 9 - 12 is Tues-

day, June 13, 2023. Regents exams will be

administered June 14 – 16 and June 20 - 23.

Looking ahead, the District anticipates welcoming students on Thursday, September 7, 2023, for the opening of the 2023-24 school year.

love for the town and its community.



Vestal Police Chief, Stace Kintner, received authorization to promote Devin Mullins to a vacant Sergeant patrol position for the police Department at the VPSA rate of \$91,300. In other police Department news, the Town Board authorized Vestal Police Chief Stace Kintner to welcome and appoint Maxwell Kelley to a vacant Police Officer position effective June 3, 2023 at the PBA rate of \$66,714. Police Officer Kelley will transfer from the Broome County Sheriff's Dept., where he has served since March 2021.

Vestal Little League to receive police radar units to measure pitch speed. Vestal Town Board agreed that Police Chief, Stace Kintner could donate to the Vestal Little League, two retired RADAR units that have been out of service for twenty years in as-is condition. Also approved was the sale of two additional retired police RADAR units.
