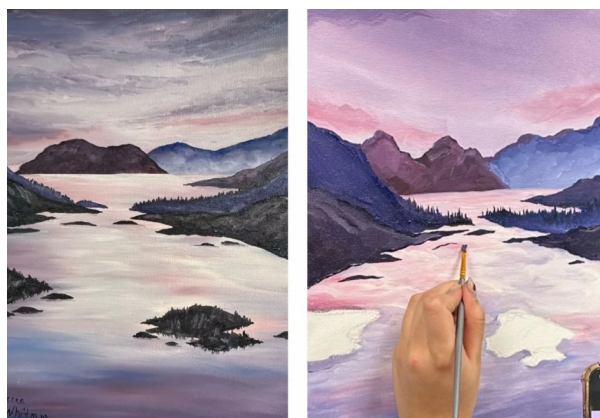

## Be Among “The First to Say Thank You” as Our Community Salutes Students Entering the Military

The Conklin Kiwanis Club is preparing a ceremony to honor the high school graduates from the schools of the Broome/Tioga BOCES District who are entering the military upon graduation. This year, “The First to Say Thank You,” will be held on Wednesday, June 21, 2023, at 7:00 p.m., at Windsor Central High School in Windsor, NY. The public is invited to attend.

This is the ninth year that the Conklin Kiwanis Club has partnered with “Our Community Salutes (OCS)” a national, non-profit organization created to recognize and honor high school seniors (and their parents) who plan to enlist in the armed services after graduation. The first OCS ceremony was held in southern New Jersey in 2009, and they have now spread across the nation. The inaugural ceremony in the Southern Tier was held in 2013. The program was cancelled in 2020 and 2021 due to the pandemic.

Speakers at the Windsor ceremony include Dr. Jason Andrews, Superintendent Windsor Central School Dis-

trict; Captain Brett White, Army National Guard; Eugene Clark, National Executive Director, Our Community Salutes; and Keynote Speaker Major General Peter S. Lennon, United States Army (Ret).

The program also features the Windsor High School Music Department, the Color Guard from the Broome County Veterans’ Memorial Association, National Anthem by Sergeant Dan Burgess; Invocation from Chaplain (Major) Timothy Miller and a number of presentations made to the recruits. Former Executive Producer and Anchor of FOX40 News, Jason Weinstein is the host for the evening.

The Edward P. Maloney Pipe Band will be playing outside the school to welcome guests.

A brief reception will follow the ceremony.

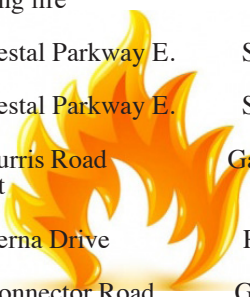

# TOB Man Arrested with Vestal Warrant for Multiple Felonies

Adam G. Gurney, 38, was arrested and charged with multiple felony domestic abuse charges and an outstanding warrant on Tuesday,

June 6, 2023. Broome County Sheriff's Deputies responded to a report of a physical injury domestic dispute in the Town of Binghamton.

Upon arrival, deputies found a female victim with several cuts and blood on her face. The victim reported that her boyfriend, Adam G. Gurney, age 38 of Binghamton, had attacked her, striking and grabbing her face before attempting to choke her. Gurney then allegedly bit her in the nose, ripping her nose ring out. The victim's roommate reportedly heard the struggle from the next room and separated the couple.

A Full Stay Away Order of Protection against Gurney from Johnson City was in force due to assault and physical injury that was found. Gurney was also found to have an outstanding arrest warrant through the Town of Vestal on charges of Criminal Contempt in the 2nd Degree for violating another order of protection.

Adam G. Gurney was arrested and charged with:

- Criminal Contempt in the 1st, violating a stay away order of protection through physical contact, a Class E Felony

- Aggravated Family Offense with more than one assault conviction within 5 years, a Class E Felony

- Criminal obstruction of breathing or blood circulation, a Class A Misdemeanor

- Harassment in the 2nd Degree, a Violation.

Gurney was arraigned and has remained in custody of the Broome County Sheriff's Office. He is scheduled to answer for his charges at a later date in the Town of Binghamton Court.

## Last Day of Attendance Scheduled for Vestal Students



Vestal Central School District, assuming that there are no emergency closings between now and the end of the school year, has anticipated the last day of school for students in Grades K – 8 and 9 – 12.

In order to meet the minimum number-of-hours requirement and 180 days of instruction mandated by New York State, the District has scheduled the last day of pupil attendance for students in Grades K – 8 for Friday, June 23, 2023. Both Thursday, June 22, and Friday, June 23, will be half days for students in Grades K - 8.

At Vestal High School, the last day of pupil attendance for Grades 9 – 12 is Tuesday, June 13, 2023.

Regents exams will be administered June 14 – 16 and June 20 - 23.

Looking ahead, the District anticipates welcoming students on Thursday, September 7, 2023, for the opening of the 2023-24 school year.

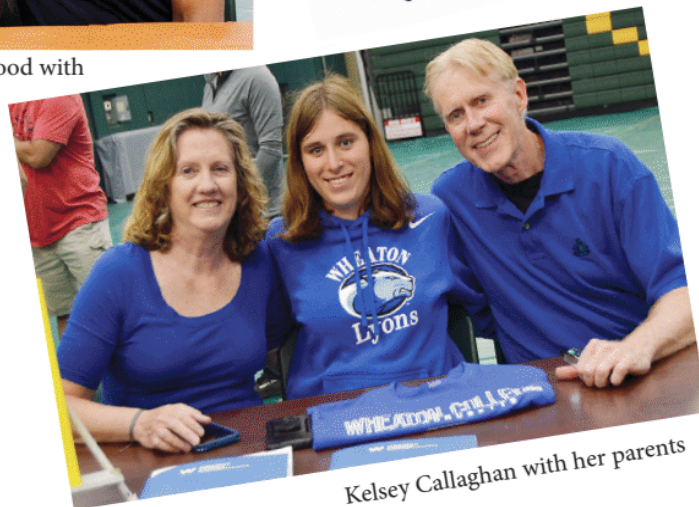

# Proposed Vestal Coffee Drive -Thru

The recent Planning Board meeting took up review for a coffee shop drive-thru business. Planning Board Chairwoman, Madeleine Cotts, pointed out, "The Planning Board would not vote on this application at this time because this was a preliminary plan meeting. Brew Family LLC members, Jeff Coughlan and Kelly Oventhey, stated they are planning to open up in Vestal at the intersection of Vestal Parkway and Plaza Drive. Planning Board Chairwoman Cotts along with Planning Board members; Michon Stuart, Dan Hayes and Bob Warner discussed with Keith Barney of Keystone Associates, and the owners the proposed plans. Jeff Coughlan pointed out, "7 BREW COFFEE is a coffee shop chain that is currently located in 70 locations in twenty-five states." Continuing that "7 Brew coffee shop will be a drive-thru only coffee business located just off the service road at the Vestal Parkway and Plaza Drive intersection. There will be two 12 1/2-foot-wide drive thru lanes with seven Brew Coffee service attendants, who will exit the building through sliding glass doors and walk up to each car at any point in the line to take the customer's order and payment on a tablet. The customers will then drive up to the next station, where they will receive their coffee order. Our plans show a walk-up door, but our number one focus will be the drive-up customers. Walk-ups will not be encouraged. If needed, the customer will be accommodated temporarily. However, we are not planning on having inside sit down service. Our hours of operation will be Sunday – Thursday- 5:30 a.m. to 10:00 p.m., Friday and Saturday -5:30 a.m. – 11:00 p.m. We estimate the typical average cars per day will be 179."

It was pointed out all current existing asphalt along with some curbing would be removed. The current asphalt swale will be replaced with a storm water pipe. Planting areas will be on the corners of the lot. There will be pole lighting. There will be a sidewalk that will be connected to the new trail between the service road and the Vestal Parkway. However, the current submitted plans did not show a sidewalk on Plaza Drive. Planning Board members expressed their concerns regarding the safety of the customers walking along Plaza Drive, where there is no sidewalk. The Planning Board suggested in their updated

plans that they consider installing a five-foot wide sidewalk that would straddle their property line, along the area in question on Plaza Drive and then connect up to their entrance, with an accessible ramp to their business property. Landscaping could be used to safely direct walkers onto the property. Landscaping was discussed and it was clarified that the plantings on the drawings are generic on the franchise's plans, and aren't what will be actually planted. Additional stop signs and stop bars were also discussed, along with the fact 7 Brew's business patrons should not have a significant impact on traffic in that area. A bypass lane was planned to accommodate taller vehicles when the canopies would prevent drive-thru service due to height issues. Town Engineer Vern Myers requested the photo-metrics be shown for the lighting on the south east side of the building that faces one of the U Club buildings across the street. 7-Brew representatives still need to submit completed plans to the Planning Board for the required drainage study, DOT traffic study, revised landscape plan, as well as the suggested sidewalk plan.

# School Nurse Michelle Hroncich is a Real Hero!

The Southern Tier American Red Cross hosted its Real Heroes breakfast on May 25, 2023, at the DoubleTree in Binghamton. We are honored that Vestal Middle School Nurse Michelle Hroncich was selected to receive the chapter's Education Award for 2023.

Here is her Real Heroes' story, from the event program:

"It was April 18, 2022, when School Nurse Michelle Hroncich responded to a cardiac medical incident in the hallway at Vestal Middle School. Medical bag in hand, Michelle saw a student lying on the floor. She rolled the student over and began treatment. Michelle deployed four rounds of defibrillation using the school's AED and administered several sequences of CPR for 10 minutes until EMS crews arrived.

Michelle has been a Registered Nurse for 23 years and specialized in cardiac care. In addition, she has been a CPR instructor and paramedic. One medical professional commented that the student 'hit the trifecta' with Michelle as her multiple skills and detailed knowledge were invaluable during this response. Hospital staff reported that the CPR was successful and that the student was stable, awake, and talking. Doctors shared with the student's parents that were it not for the intervention received at the school, their child would not have made it to the hospital.

Michelle said that it was humbling to learn that the student was doing well; one month later, the student was back in school and graduated from the eighth grade two months later. Michelle commented that she was trained to be the calm in the storm, training for the worst and hoping

for the best. In this case, the best certainly prevailed."

Michelle was nominated by Jeffrey Ahearn, Vestal Superintendent, Regina Felice, Public Information Coordinator, and Sarah Wiggins, Vestal Middle School Principal.

The American Red Cross Real Heroes breakfast is held to honor local, everyday people whose actions exemplify the true spirit of the American Red Cross: humanity, strength and courage.
