

THE AWFUL TRAIN WRECK CONTINUED

Throughout the year, the Town of Vestal will continue to celebrate its remarkable Bicentennial celebration by hosting various events all year long. One of these events will be the moving of the town's museum back to the Rail Trail in the fall. Now, many residents in and around the area may not know the significance of this move or why it will be returning to the Rail Trail of all places. The reasoning behind this dates back to the late 1880's when the Vestal Museum was known as the D.L.&W Railroad Depot.


The Delaware, Lackawanna, and Western Railroad Depot (often shortened to D.L.&W) was first constructed in 1881 and was about a block north of where Vestal's 4 Corners sit today. The Depot opened a year later in 1882 and served as a point of departure for locals along the New York City to Buffalo line for many years as they left and came back to the area. It became a popular point during the World War I and World War II eras as many homecomings occurred

there as well as the famous 'Phoebe Snow' train made regular appearances. Unfortunately, the D.L.&W. Railroad Depot closed its doors in 1959 but was renovated by the town's Historical Society and soon evolved into the Vestal Museum we know today. All the original exterior and interior details were kept, including the structure's iconic Pagoda design.


While it was still in service, the railroad depot was also located about 700 ft. from where the awful trainwreck that took place in 1901 occurred. What led up to this wreck was Train No.61's engine has reached the depot while the caboose was still further away from the station. The train had stopped to 'take on water' at a tank that was near the station. Meanwhile, a two-engine wildcat train had left Binghamton going west about a half an hour after when No.61 had originally left the city. As the wildcat came up to the Vestal railroad depot, it spotted No.61's caboose and blasted its horns as it was coming in

quickly. Unfortunately, it was too late as the wildcat engines struck the back of No.61 as it set off the 5 tons of dynamite that were being carried in a box car just head of the train's caboose. The aftermath of this crash not only destroyed parts of Vestal, but neighboring towns as well. Currently, there is a historical marker along the Rail Trail around the area where the wreck took place with limited information. If you'd like to know more details about this event, then you should check out The Awful <u>Trainwreck</u> by Maryann Thompson.

As mentioned before in the previous articles, Thompson had spent over 20 years researching what had caused the wreck along with finding details about the people who were involved and the impact it had left on the local communities. 



Board approves residency change for clerk

The Town Board then voted and passed a Local Law amending the Public Officers Law and a Town Law pertaining to the Office of the First Deputy Town Clerk of the Town of Vestal. Town Supervisor John Schaffer explained, "This is being done for the purpose of expanding the residency requirement to Broome County, New York for that Town position only due to the lack of applicants received for this position. It was decided to promote someone already working in the Town Clerk's Office. Local Law G is only for this position. If, some other Town of Vestal employee position presents the need for looking outside The Town of Vestal residency, then a new law will be needed to be voted on and adopted at that time." The Town Board then voted and approved the new appointment of Tammy Kunes to start as Deputy Town Clerk and Sarah Maney to start as 1st Deputy Town Clerk on August 3 and 14, 2023.
