10-Years Since The Death Of Trooper Christopher Skinner



This time of year, we mark the solemn 10-year anniversary of the Line of Duty Death of NYSP trooper Christopher Skinner. Our thoughts and prayers are with his family, friends and loved ones.

On May 29, 2014, Trooper Christopher G. Skinner, 42, was

struck and killed by a vehicle while conducting a traffic stop on Interstate 81 in the town of Chenango.

Trooper Skinner was patrolling a construction zone and had made a traffic stop. He was in the process of interviewing the operator when a passing vehicle veered from the driving lane to intentionally strike Trooper Skinner. Trooper Skinner was killed instantly.

Trooper Skinner was a 13-year veteran and was a member of the Troop C Traffic Incident Management Detail at the time of his death.


