

On December 28th, 2024, just before 1am, the midnight patrol sergeant conducted a traffic stop for a speeding violation on SR 434. The sergeant made his initial approach of the vehicle and spoke with the motorist. After obtaining their license, registration and insurance information he began walking back to his patrol vehicle to issue a warning for a minor speeding violation. When the sergeant opened his driver side door to enter his vehicle another motorist drove across the median of SR 434 and struck his patrol vehicle, hitting the open patrol vehicle's door into his wrist. The suspect vehicle that struck the patrol vehicle came to a stop approximately 100 feet away. Upon approaching the suspect vehicle, it became apparent that this was not an intentional act but an impaired driver that lost control of their vehicle. Additional officers responded to the scene and took the driver of the vehicle into custody for Driving While Ability Impaired, Criminal Possession of a Controlled Substance 7th degree (methamphetamine), Reckless Endangerment 2nd degree and numerous Vehicle and Traffic Law violations.

The driver of the vehicle, Richard T. Maddox was taken

into custody for the aforementioned charges where he submitted to a chemical test of his blood. A quantity of narcotics was discovered on his person and tested positive for methamphetamine. Maddox was processed and issued an appearance ticket returnable to the Town of Vestal Court.

There are no routine calls for service in this line of work. They may sound routine to the public due to the high volume of specific complaints that get publicized, such as domestics, larcenies, disputes, alarms and vehicle stops but they all involve some level of human interaction and even without ill intent, people are unpredictable. We commend the sergeant for maintaining his composure during this tense incident. This "routine" traffic stop was anything but and we are glad that the sergeant only suffered minor injuries. We also commend the responding officers for their part in the arrest, including K9 handler Schultz and her K9 partner Vaughn. We would also like to thank the New York State Police for their role in the impaired driving investigation. 

## Attention Private Employers: Paid Prenatal Leave Began January 1st, 2025

Beginning January 1, 2025, New York's Paid Prenatal Leave law went into effect. This first-in-the-nation law will require private employers to provide pregnant employees with 20 hours of paid prenatal leave, ensuring that pregnant employees can take time off for medical appointments related to pregnancy without the fear of losing income.

Paid Prenatal Leave is applicable to both full-time and part-time employees.

Pregnancy-related health care includes physical examinations, medical procedures, monitoring, testing, and discussions with a health care provider related to the pregnancy.

This personal leave time may be taken in hourly increments, and compensation provided must be at the employee's regular rate of pay or the applicable minimum wage, whichever is greater.

Employers are not required to pay an employee for unused prenatal personal leave at the time of separation from employment.

With Paid Prenatal Personal Leave, businesses can help expectant workers focus on their health needs without financial worry while providing them with the peace of mind that comes with knowing they work in a place that puts their needs first.

Everyone should be able to access the care they need, especially when they are expecting. Paid Prenatal Leave is another shining example of how New York State and New York State businesses are committed to supporting the health and safety of all workers.

## REMINDER: New York State Minimum Wage Increased On January 1st

Governor Kathy Hochul has announced that on January 1, New York's minimum wage will increase to \$16.50/hour in New York City, Westchester, and Long Island, and \$15.50/hour for the rest of the state. Raising New York's minimum wage to keep pace with inflation will benefit hundreds of thousands of minimum wage workers across the state.

"In this current era of inflation and rising costs, every cent counts for all New Yorkers, especially workers who earn the minimum wage. By gradually increasing wages for the lowest earners, we are ensuring businesses can adjust to the change while also helping more families make ends meet," said NYSDOL Commissioner Roberta Reardon.

This increase is the continuation of the historic multi-year plan to increase the minimum wage to 2027 and beyond. Looking ahead, the minimum wage will increase by \$0.50 in 2026. In 2027, it will increase annually at a rate determined by the Consumer Price Index.
