2025-2026 Windsor Central School **District's Universal Pre**kindergarten Program for 3PK and **4PK Students**



Applications are now being accepted for the 2025-2026 Universal Prekindergarten Program (4PK and 3PK) in the Windsor Central School District. The program is free for Windsor school district residents.

To be eligible for 4PK, a student must be 4 years old on or before December 1, 2025. To be eligible for 3PK, a student must be 3 years old on or before December 1, 2025. All students must meet New York State immunization requirements.

If interested, please visit our website (www.windsor-csd.org) and follow the Universal Prekindergarten program link under Programs or contact Amy Barton at 607-655-8216 for assistance.

Students will be placed through a lottery, as required by the New York State Education Department guidelines. Pre-K students will attend either the 3PK or 4PK program in the school zone where they live. If that class is full, students will attend the next closest building.

All plans for 2025-2026 UPK program are tentative and depend on receiving enough funding from the State Education Department.







Windsor Central School District teachers engaged in a range of professional development activities during Friday's Superintendent's Conference Day.

Elementary educators concluded their two-year training in LETRS, a program that teaches the skills needed to master the foundational and fundamentals of reading and writing instruction, using research-proven strategies.

New York Governor Kathy Hochul announced that all teachers and teacher training programs will shift to the Science of Reading.

The science of reading refers to a body of research from the fields of education, cognitive psychology, developmental psychology, and neuroscience, that explains how individuals learn how to read and best practices for reading instruction.

"This was an opportunity to train all of our staff and get in front of these best practices to ensure all of our students are getting instruction to ensure they're successful in reading, writing, listening, and speaking," said Barb Tasber, Director of Learning, Leadership, & Technology.

Windsor Central Middle School hosted a workshop on artificial intelligence, specifically seeing if AI can help answer the four critical questions of collaborative teams: what do we want students to know, how will we know they know it, what will we do if they don't know it, and what will we do if they already know it?

"As with all things in education technology, it's about added value and time saved. It's not just about the shiny new thing. Can AI identify trends in assessment data that we wouldn't see or that would take us a long time to see?" said middle school teacher Cole Battaglini, who led the AI session. "I believe AI is a tool that can usher in the next Renaissance of learning. We'd be doing ourselves a disservice if we didn't build a comfort level with it. It can help us create future-ready learners, which is why we're here."

High school teachers focused on learning instructional strategies for the classroom, using data by course and subgroup to provide equitable instruction, leading to mastery and success for all students. The presentation accounted for the varying learning styles of students and identified how to embed a variety of strategies to meet all learners

"The whole point of this day is to give teachers a toolbox full of instructional strategies so that all learners can achieve at high levels," said WCHS associate principal Kelly Warwick.

Windsor CSD Hosts 18th **Annual Safety Night** By Windsor School District

The Windsor Central School District held its 18th annual Safety Night Thursday. Members of local fire departments, New York State Police, and the Broome County Sheriff's Office joined teachers, staff, and students to be better prepared in case of emergency.

"It's about making connections with first responders, our teachers, our staff, and our students. There are daily safety concerns, so knowing how to deal with all types of safety concerns is important," said Chris Klumpp, Windsor Central High School Director of Athletics, Health, and Safety.

The group prepared for safety, medical, fire, mental health, and facilities emergencies, applying the district's safety plan for each, and testing that plan's effectiveness.

"We want to make sure that we bring everybody together so that when a response is required, everyone knows what their role is," Timothy Neumuth, NYS Police Trooper, School Community Outreach Coordinator. "The importance of this event is at least a nine (on a scale of 10). You can still do it without knowing all those people, but if you know the names and faces, it makes it a lot easier. The more you get to know those people, the more you know their skills, the more you know what they're capable of and that's the key in a stressful situation. Without this forum, we're not going to get that"

"There's not a year that has gone by when we haven't implemented some change because of what we learn here. We hear a perspective we haven't heard before," said Dr. Jason Andrews, Superintendent of the Windsor CSD.

Among the safety upgrades over the past year in the district is the expansion of the Vigilon camera system. There are now 204 cameras up and running in the five district buildings.

Staff have also continued their training in Trauma Informed Skills for Educators (TISE) and Cognitive Behavioral Intervention for Trauma in Schools (CBITS), thanks to the STOP School Violence Grant. The grant is also funding universal social-emotional learning programs to try to assist students before they become safety risks.

Windsor Central High School students brought their perspective the district's approach to safety during the event.

"We want to have an understanding of how exactly the adults who would be in charge of us know what their duties are so we can support them and guide other students in the right general direction," said WCHS senior Cameron Wallace.

Teachers left Friday with a plan about using these strategies in their classrooms as soon as next week.

The Town of Colesville lies in the northeast part of Broome County and is bounded on the north by Chenango County, on the east by the Town of Sanford, on the south by the Town of Windsor, and on the west by the Towns of Kirkwood and Fenton. The town was formed on April 3, 1821, from the Town of Windsor. Harpursville is the largest hamlet in the town although it is not incorporated.

Colesville derives its name from pioneer Nathaniel Cole, a revolutionary soldier. He settled here in 1795, on a hill south of Harpursville, known as Coles Hill. He built a tavern there which was in operation as early as 1800. It was the first tavern between Albany and Binghamton. Broome County's Nathaniel Cole Park was opened in the town in 1974 and is located about two miles from the site of its namesake's tavern.
